

# Matson Returns To A&M

Randy Matson will join the staff of the Association of Former Students at Texas A&M Sept. 1.

The world record holding former Olympian will be involved in the total spectrum of alumni and university activities, according to Buck Weirus, association executive director.

Association contributions to TAMU through the annual fund

have totalled more than \$1 million each for the last two years.

Matson's work will range from club and class activities to association-wide programs.

President Jack K. Williams said he is "delighted to have one of Texas A&M's and the world's great athletes and a top scholar return to the university. Randy Matson will be an asset to our total program of excellence and

a refreshing inspiration to all Aggie undergraduates."

A 1967 Texas A&M graduate with a degree in marketing, Matson has been in charge of West Texas State University's Buffalo Club, which raises funds for athletic scholarships.

Matson was with a Houston brokerage firm earlier.

The 1968 Olympic gold medal winner put the shot 71 feet, 5 1/2 inches at Kyle Field in 1967 to establish a new world record in the event. Matson also lettered in basketball with the Aggies in 1966.

All the proposals now go to the Coordinating Board.

A \$124,073 contract was awarded to Brytex Construction Co. of Bryan to build a residential and chemical fire control building for the Texas Engineering Extension Service's Firemen's Training School at TAMU. Bryan Electric Service was awarded a \$46,250 contract to install street lighting for the university's new dormitory complex. Two contracts totaling \$179,957 were awarded to Evans-Monical Commercial, Inc., of Houston for dining hall and dormitory furniture for Prairie View.

Appropriations covered such TAMU projects as planning for construction of a new agricultural administration building, renovating the golf course and designing and constructing docking facilities at the Mitchell Campus in Galveston for the university's environmental engineering vessels which are currently berthed at Morgan's Point.
