Two contracts totaling \$179,957 were awarded to Evans-Monical Commercial, Inc., of Houston for dining hall and dormitory furniture for Prairie View.

ppropriations covered such TAMU projects as planning for construction of a new agricultural administration building, renovating the golf course and de signing and constructing docking facilities at the Mitchell Campus in Galveston for the university's environmental engineering vessels which are currently berthed at Morgan's Point.
