President Nixon announced Monday he will end the military draft, a three-decade-old relic of the World War II era, by July 1, 1973, and replace it with an allvolunteer armed force.

A 21-year-old Houston woman who said she was burned up over federal money for welfare was charged Monday night with burning the shrubbery outside the federal building here in protest.

Ellen Janice Watkins was charged with willful destruction of property in the burning of about 20 wax leaf Lagustrums Sunday. She told reporters it was the only way she knew to protest the government use of her tax dollars.

"I don't think what I work hard for should be given to those on welfare," said Miss Watkins, who is presently unemployed.

Sunday night, she told reporters, she was drinking and decided it was time to act. She said she took a gallon of gasoline to the federal building, doused the bushes and set them afire with her cigarette lighter. A federal officer saw her leave and took down the license number of her car, arson investigators said.
