Defense Outstanding in Scrimmage

Lex Leads Aggies In Offensive Show

For those people who are still wondering if A&M's offensive unit can score—it can.

Lex James led the first team offensive unit for six touchdowns in ten possessions while chalking up 533 yards total offense.

For those people who are wondering if A&M's defensive unit can keep opponents from scoring—it can.

The defensive unit allowed a total of 12 yards on 61 plays and 18 possessions. Penalties gave the reserve offensive unit 53 yards for two first downs and two first downs were gained through the passing route.

James led the team in rushing with 116 yards on 11 carries and gained another 121 yards by completing nine of 20 pass attempts. However, James did look sluggish toward the end of the two hour encounter and threw three straight interceptions.

The defensive unit played impeccably well in holding the reserve unit to a -43 yards rushing on 38 plays. The pass did hurt in a few instances as petite Jeff Gomez hit on eight of 23 passes for 55 yards. He had four picked off as the defense returned them for 86 yards.

Dwight LaBauve picked off two for 40 yards, Kent Finley one for 18 and Robert Murski one for 28 yards. Dennis Carruth also recovered a fumble for the defensive team.

On the first offensive possession, a fumble crushed the drive at the ten yard line after a brilliant series called by James. After that, a fire was lit under the unit as it scored four straight times.

Green took it over on the second possession with a dazzling 25 yard jaunt. Freshman sensation, Bubba Bean, scored the following three times on runs of nine, 25 and 17 yards.

On the next series, Richard Osborne dropped two passes which were perfectly thrown by James and the offense lost possession. When the offense got it back, James gave Osborne a chance to redeem himself on a crucial third and 15 situation. Osborne had no freshman jitters on this play and James ended up scoring on a beautiful run of 29 yards.

Lex had his first pass intercepted during the next series at the 50-yard line and the reserve defensive unit began to get fired up. Lex threw two more interceptions and then the biggest blow of the night against the talented starting offensive team. The reserve defense held the "James Gang" for three plays for the first non-first down producing possession of the evening.

James made it up on the final possession when he hit Osborne for the final touchdown with a 10-yard strike.
Brad Dusek was runner-up in

the rushing attack carrying the ball nine times for 116 yards but no touchdowns. Green ran for 97 yards on nine carries and one touchdown while Bean had his first sub-100-yard night, gaining only 84 yards on ten carries and three touchdowns.

Osborne led all receivers with six receptions for 77 yards and one touchdown while tight end

Homer May caught three for 24 yards.

This was the end of the season for the Aggies as next week will be set aside to get ready for the season's final game against Wichita State.

Spitz Batters Olympic Gold; Tracksters Goof, Miss Start

MUNICH (AP)—America's human torpedo, Mark Spitz, barreled to his fourth and fifth gold medals en route to an Olympic swimming pinnacle Thursday, but a goof cost the United States its two fastest sprinters for the 100-meter dash.

Spitz, the 22-year-old marvel from Carmichael, Calif., swept to a world record victory in the men's 100-meter butterfly and minutes later anchored the U.S. 800-meter freestyle relay team to an astounding 7:35.78 world record clocking.

There was no acclaim for the American runners, however, as co-world record-holder Eddie Hart and Rey Robinson were disqualified for missing quarter-final heats in the 100-meter trials.

Assistant U.S. Coach Stan Wright took the blame. "I gave them the wrong time," a depressed Wright said. "It's all my fault."
Hours later, American officials

called a news conference and said the mistake occurred because they could not obtain an up-to-date, accurate schedule of events.

Now Taylor stands alone to test the Soviet Union's great Valery Borzov and the world's other top sprinters in the 100-meter final Friday, an event the U.S. has lost only once in the last 40 years of the Games.

Spitz' double-medal sweep highlighted a good day for the Americans, who saw their freestyle wrestlers win a gold medal, two silvers and a bronze, with two more golds in sight. And the

U.S. water polo team gained the final round with a 5-0 record after upsetting defending champion Yugoslavia 5-3.

So far the U.S. leads in medal collecting with 10 gold, 11 silvers and eight bronze for a total of 29. The powerful Soviet Union moved ahead of East Germany as the chief challenger. The Russians had a total of 18, including seven gold.

Spitz again was marvelous. The tall, mustachioed Indiana University star won the 100-meter butterfly in 54.27 seconds to beat his mark of :54.66.

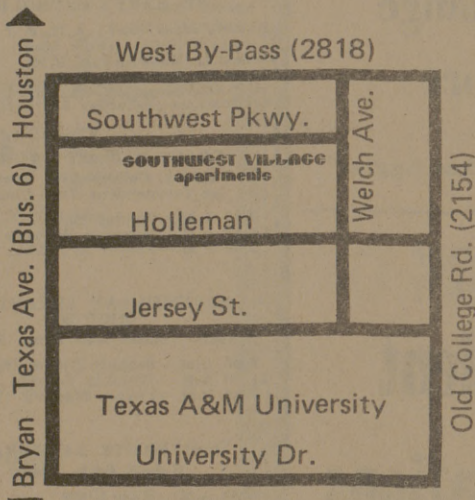
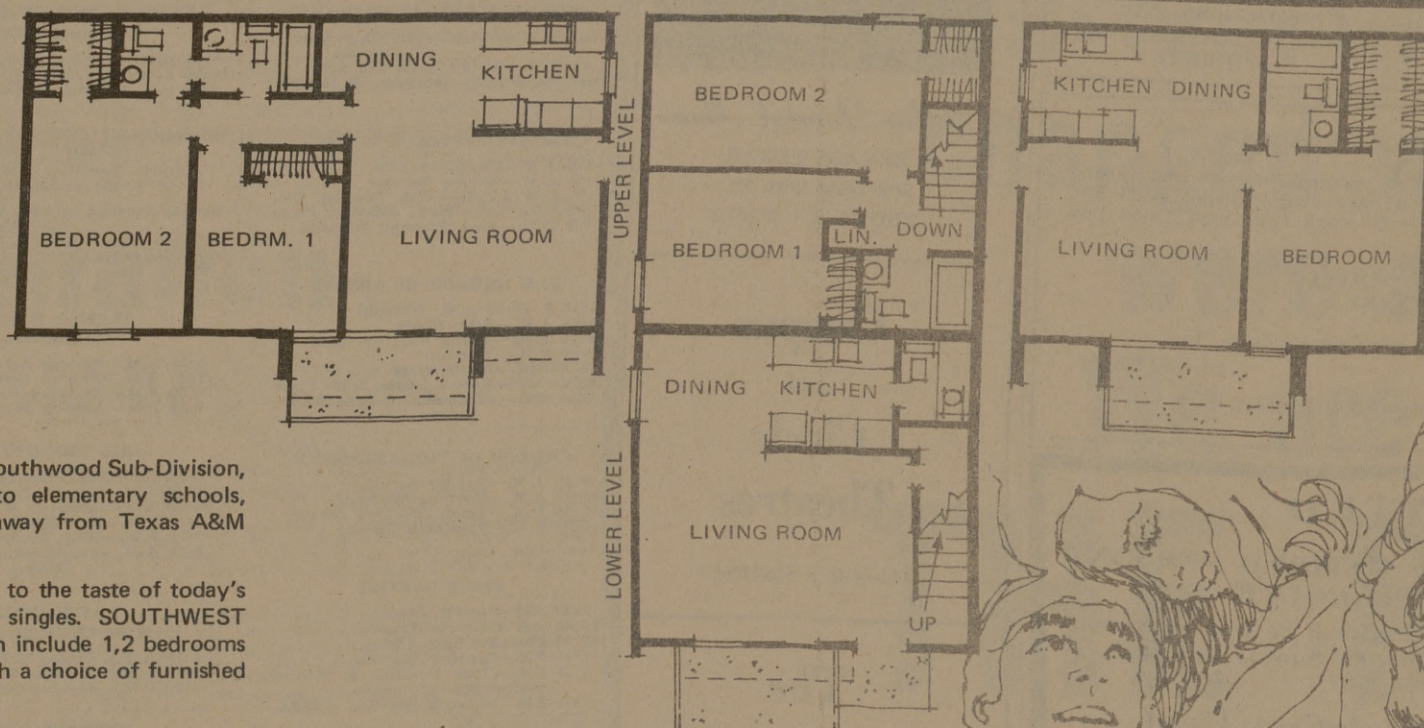
