State Dept. Job Forms Available

Forms for making applications to take examinations and additional information for service with the U. S. Information Agency or Department of State may be obtained from Dr. J. M. Nance, head of the History Department. Applications must be postmarked no later than next Oct. 21.

Competitive written examinations will be given next Dec. 2 to candidates for career opportunities as Foreign Service officers of the Department of State, or as Foreign Service Information officers of the USIA.

While the majority of candidates have traditionally been college students or recent college graduates, men and women with professional and vocational experience outside of college are also strongly encouraged to take the examination. The State Department and USIA provide equal employment opportunity to everyone regardless of race, sex, marital status, religion or ethnic background.

Most new officers are promptly assigned abroad after preparatory training in Washington. Usually officers serve two initial tours abroad, with home leave at government expense in between, and then have a Washington assignment. A normal tour of duty lasts two years, and officers are expected to be available for worldwide service, as are their families. Anyone who is prepared to serve only at specific posts or in specified countries or regions will not be appointed.

Initial appointments are at Class 8 (\$9,663-\$10,965) or Class 7 (\$10,566-\$12,578). Class 1 carries a salary of \$36,000. While officers are abroad they may receive supplementary allowances for quarters, living costs, hardship differentials and educational allow-ances for children.

Candidates for service within

least seven and a half years as of the date of the written examination, and at least 10 years a citizen at the time of appointment.

Knowledge of a foreign language is not a requirement for appointment to the Foreign Service. After appointment, however, officers are expected to acquire an acceptable level of proficiency in at least one foreign language, and junior officers are limited to no more than one promotion until they do so. New officers are given language tests in one or more of 30 languages after they enter on duty.

Applicants must be at least 21 years of age at the date of the written examination (or 20 years of age if he has successfully completed his junior year of college). Applicants must have been citizens of the United States at at

Metallurgy Program Gets \$\$ From 3 Houston Groups

Three Houston firms have contributed equipment to the Metallurgical Engineering Department that will support the department's metallurgy program.

Dr. C. M. Simmang, department head, said the equipment will be used in laboratory teaching and research in areas of metals and materials.

The items, valued at \$1,928, consist of a portable radiographic unit from the Chicago Bridge and Iron Works; a Lindbergh gas furnace and salt bath furnace assembly, Houston Heat Treating; and three stress-rupture test machines, Cameron Iron Works.

The radiographic unit reveals faults in metal structures, such as a crack in a boiler, through non-destructive techniques. It was acquired in cooperation with William A. Pogre, Chicago Bridge and Iron.

Dr. Simmang noted the acquisition provides the department a capability it did not have.

The gas furnace and salt bath furnace assembly, arranged with Edward F. Moore Jr., Houston Heat Treating, extends the versatility of the existing heat treating lab at TAMU, Simmang added.

Stress-rupture machines including all accessories establishes a new laboratory capability in the areas of mechanical testing and corrosion studies, through efforts of Don Burns and Norman Wilkerson of Cameron Iron Works.

Dr. Simmang noted that though the metallurgy option is an undergraduate program in mechanical engineering at TAMU, the new equipment will be available for graduate student use.
