

The deep-back in the "I" is Gary Dixon (5-8, 188). The senior running back is another important cog to the Nebraska ball control game.

The Nebraska defense, which was considered to be one of the best, if not the best, in the nation last year, is still intact with Willie Harper and Ric Glover returning for another campaign. Both All-Americans, the fast and strong linemen almost dare all runners to come their way. Both keep the pressure on the opposition's quarterback and must be neutralized by the Wishbone attack of the Aggies if they are to put any dents on the scoreboard.


