Animal Diseases Research In Private Hands

Research into companion animal diseases is in the hands of individuals and private organizations, participants in the state's first pet seminar were told here particularly supporting work just last weekend. Dr. Fred Lynd, research vet-

erinary pathologist at the Southwest Medical School in San Antonio, told 133 pet club officials "it is difficult to predict the future trends of research in com-

Support for pet research, Dr. Lynd said, has been very limited. "None of the health organizations are interested in this angle, for application to our pets. And, of course, the federal or state funds cannot be spent in this direction, he stressed.

He also called for continued research into bone and joint disease, healing and repair of cartilage (such as disfigured ears and between the vertebrae of the backbone) disc problems, tendons which hold up the head and hold toes and legs in position and finally investigations into proper healing after surgery.

On the bright side, Dr. Lynd noted veterinarians "know more about dog and cat nutrition than the physician does about human nutrition."

He predicted by 1981 the U.S. will need about 43,000 specialists in companion animal medicine from dog psychiatry to dermatology.
