

McGovern, Nixon Differ On War's Importance

Democrat George McGovern said Thursday the Vietnam war remains "the central affliction of American foreign policy,"

but President Nixon said the presidential election campaign will not influence "what we do at the negotiating table."

In a White House news conference, Nixon said the Vietnam peace negotiations "are in a sensitive stage" but he declined to

predict when or if a settlement will be reached. McGovern centered on the war in a major campaign speech outlining his foreign policy goals. He said if Nixon is re-elected the

war "will drag on for years until it either exhausts or pulverizes the people of Indochina."

The Democratic presidential nominee also said a Nixon re-election would mean "another four more years in jail for these prisoners of war in Hanoi."

In a speech to Cleveland's City Club, McGovern said Nixon "has tricked millions of Americans into thinking that we are staying in Indochina in order to get our prisoners out of their cells in Hanoi" when the way "to get them out is to end the war."

Remote Sensing Center Receives Grant From Navy

A&M's Remote Sensing Center has received \$16,490 from the Naval Ordnance Laboratory to continue development of a real-time Arctic ice identification system.

It brings total Navy funding to \$48,500. This year's grant provides funds for the assembly and testing of an electronic laboratory model of an aircraft system to measure ice thickness.

Dr. John W. Rouse Jr., RSC director, is principal investigator, and John A. Schell, director of the center's Data Analysis Laboratory, is project manager.

Schell said through a generalized system design, the airborne system will have application in a variety of other areas such as water quality and sea state parameter measurements.

Clothing Drive Begins Saturday

Clothing for the Austin State Home will be picked up Saturday by members of the Omega Phi Alpha service sorority chapter at A&M.

President Stuart L. Stewart of Bryan said the items will be sorted and delivered to the Austin institution Saturday.

"We need mendable clothing of all sizes," she said. "OPA members will do sewing repairs, but contributed items need to be in fairly good condition." Pickup will begin at 9:30 a.m. Saturday.

Sargent Shriver, McGovern's vice presidential running mate, said in Denver that Nixon needs to have his conscience "sensitized" to what he said is corruption and scandal in the administration.

Shriver disagreed with Nixon's statements that the corruption charges would backfire for the Democrats, and he criticized again what he called "the gross and scandalous mismanagement of the nation's federal housing program."

Vice President Spiro T. Agnew said in Charleston, W. Va., that McGovern's campaign has been so plagued by inconsistency that the American electorate is dizzy.

"Pick an issue—almost any issue—and you'll find Sen. McGovern has been on more than one side of it, sometimes all," Agnew said.


