## 'Best Cowboy' Award Won By Graham

Don Graham earned the title of 'best all-around cowboy' in the three days of competition in the All Aggie Rodeo, which ended Saturday night.

Nick Bournham was second for the top spot and Dan Gambelin was third.

The Rodeo, which is sponsored every year by the Aggie Rodeo Club, drew 140 contestants for the nine events. The rodeo boasted bareback bronc riding, calf roping, steer wrestling and bull riding. There were also two events for girls, barrel racing and goat-tying.

"We had probably as many entries as ever before in the nine events," said Nick Bournham, Rodeo Club reporter. "And we were happy with the turn out."

The money collected by gate receipts will go to finance the Aggie Rodeo team for inter-col-

legiate competition. The Aggies belong to the southern region composed of 12 schools in Texas and Louisiana.

The Aggie Rodeo team members will compete, along with their counterparts in 10 rodeos across the region.

The team members are awarded points in each event in which they place. The points are accumulated and at the end of the rodeo season, the top two teams and the top three individuals in each event are sent to the National Finals in Bozeman, Mont.

"Most of the money is used to defray the cost of the trips," said Bournham. "And some is used to sponsor the A&M Intercollegiate Rodeo." The Aggie Intercollegiate Rodeo is part of their 10 game circuit and is scheduled for April or May.

are: Bare Back Bronc Riding, Nick Bournham; Calf Roping, Ricky Goode; Saddle Bronc Riding, Harry Davis; Steer Wrestling, Dan Gambelin; Ribbon Roping, Nick Bournham; Bull Riding, Don Graham.

In the girls events: Barrel Racing, LuAnn Potthast; Goat Tying, Rose Mary Watson.

## S.A.'s Diesel Fuel Kills Fish

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP) — About 50,000 gallons of diesel fuel has leaked into the San Antonio River from a storage tank owned by the city's utility company, killing fish downstream, officials said.

Spokesmen for the City Public Service Board said it was part of 624,000 gallons of fuel that leaked out of a 50-year-old storage tank which had been out of use for about 15 years.

Officials for the utility also said the tank was inspected before filling operations between Sept. 28. The diesel fuel was

being stored as a standby measure for the winter months, spokesmen said.

Ken Cave, water quality chief with the San Antonio River Authority, reported seeing dead fish downstream from the site of the spill, a power plant.

He said most of the fuel seeped into the ground around the tank, but about 50,000 gallons settled on the river.

Officials of the city-owned utility company said the leak was discovered Sunday and reported to the River Authority.

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS WASHINGTON — Presidential adviser Henry Kissinger's quest for a negotiated Vietnam settlement Monday headed into an unprecedented third consecutive day of discussion with the North Vietnamese in Paris.

U.S. officials here and in Paris refused to give any assessment of what is happening in Kissinger's extended sessions with Hanoi Politburo member Le Duc Tho and Xuan Thuy, chief of the North Vietnamese delegation.

But the mere fact of the extension spurred speculation that the tempo of the negotiations has been stepped up.

SAIGON — Government troops made a helicopter assault against Communist-led forces 12 miles north of Saigon Monday. South Vietnam's military command contended the enemy penetration pos-

ed no serious threat to the capital.

North Vietnamese and Viet Cong infiltrators seized a cluster of hamlets along Highway 13 near Saigon four days ago and government infantrymen have been trying since to dislodge them. Unconfirmed field reports said two hamlets were recaptured between noon and dusk.

U.S. military sources believe the enemy is trying to tie down government troops while its larger forces slip southward still closer to Saigon.

NEW YORK — Sen. George McGovern touched off a political conflict Monday by marching in New York's annual Columbus Day parade.

New York's Republican governor, Nelson A. Rockefeller, told newsmen parade officials had appealed to McGovern to stay away.

He said that McGovern's march was "the first time in 50 years that there has ever been a candidate who has tried to take advantage of the parade."

MOSCOW — Soviet officials have revealed that a drought has caused potato and vegetable crop failures.

Pravda, the voice of the Communist party, urged farmers in an editorial to prepare for a maximum effort next year "to compensate for losses of production in the current year."

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. — China said Monday it plans to raise its share of U.N. budget support from 4 per cent to 7 per cent over the next five years.

China's contribution to this year's operating budget is about \$7.1 million, the sixth largest after the United States, the Soviet Union, Britain, France and Japan.

An increase to 7 per cent would make China the third-largest contributor.

Hsing Sung-yi, the Chinese delegate, told the U.N. budget committee that China still is a developing country but that "with the development of our national economy we intend to raise our rate of assessment gradually to 7 per cent in the coming five years."

### Ags Provide Program For TDC Teachers

A&M is providing teacher training courses to instructors working with inmates of the Texas Department of Corrections.

B. M. Hackney, head of the Engineering Extension Service's Vocational Industrial Teacher Education Division, noted TDC organized the Windham School District to train inmates in occupational skills and offer high school courses leading to graduation.

TAMU conducts two teacher education courses in Huntsville for 15 Windham teachers, Hackney said. The courses, "Methods of Teaching" and "Class Management," meet certification requirements of the State Board for Vocational Education.

Dr. William H. Clayton, dean of A&M's Moody College of Marine Sciences and Maritime Resources, has been named to an advisory council which will help establish a new university in Yugoslavia.

Clayton, whose appointment was handled through the State Department, will attend the council's first meeting next week (Oct. 16-20) in Herceg-Novi, Yugoslavia. He will provide physical sciences and oceanography advice.

The new institution, the University of Montenegro, will stress the multi-disciplinary approach to education with emphasis on research, Dr. Clayton noted.

Dr. Howard Pollock, deputy administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, and Dr. Ralph Huitt, executive director of the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges, will visit A&M Tuesday.

The two men, both speakers at a TAMU-hosted meeting of the Association of Sea Grant Institutions in Houston, will receive briefings and conduct tours at four different locations. Their
