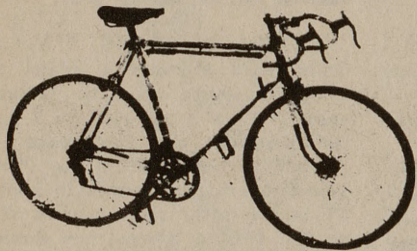

**Juveniles May Be Freed**

AUSTIN (AP) — Atty. Gen. Crawford Martin has been given one month to learn if approximately 500 juveniles in state correctional institutions waived their right to have a lawyer.

If there was no waiver, they will be released on a writ of habeas corpus on Nov. 8, State District Court Judge Charles Mathews said Monday.

The writ was filed by Steven Bercu of the Travis County Legal Aid and Defender Society, who said it was clear to him there was no waiver.

The U.S. Supreme Court decided in an Arizona case in 1967 that juveniles must be offered counsel. And Bercu said a 1969 Texas law makes representation of juveniles by a lawyer mandatory.

The writ was filed for 514 boys and girls in institutions in Gatesville, Brownwood, Crockett and Gainesville who were interviewed by Bercu, other lawyers and law students last January and February. He estimated that was about 60 per cent of the population of

those institutions at that time.

Bercu admitted that some of those have since been released and he agreed that the writ would not apply to them.

Asst. Atty. Gen. Max Fluesche said the proper courts to determine the issue of waiver were in the counties that committed the youngsters to the Texas Youth Council.

To grant the writ Monday for all of them would be a "travesty of justice," Fluesche said.

"They're not in reform schools for singing too loud in Sunday school," he said.

The judge agreed that as a matter of courtesy he should let authorities in the 120 counties involved know what was about to happen.

Fluesche said Dallas County Dist. Atty. Henry Warde already has promised he will prosecute Dallas juveniles released on such a writ.

Bercu said the attorney general already had the information that the judge was giving more time to obtain. He said a federal civil rights action in Serhamn dealt with the same question of lack of counsel for most of the juveniles in custody of the Texas Youth Council, and that the attorney general's office had been working on that case for four months.

But Fluesche said all the records reflect is that the 514 were not represented. He did not know if they waived the right to be represented, he said.

**U. S., Soviets Meet, Prepare Joint Manned Space Mission**

United States and Soviet working groups began two weeks of meetings in Moscow Monday on the Apollo-Soyuz Test Project, a joint manned space mission planned for 1975.

The working groups represent the National Aeronautics and Space Administration and the Academy of Sciences of the USSR. The joint mission was provided for by the agreement

which President Nixon and Chairman Kosygin signed in Moscow last May 24.

An Apollo spacecraft and a Soviet Soyuz will dock in Earth orbit and the crews will exchange visits. The mission is designed to test equipment which will permit cooperative scientific missions as well as establish an international crew rescue capability in space.

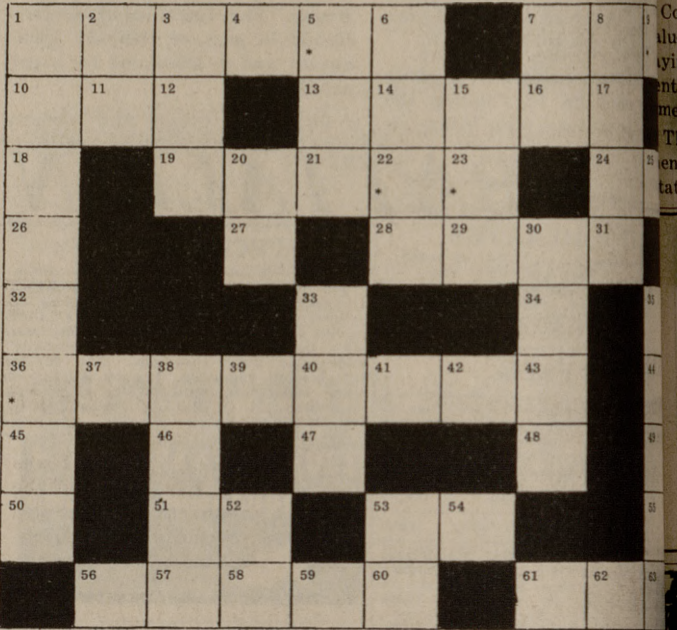

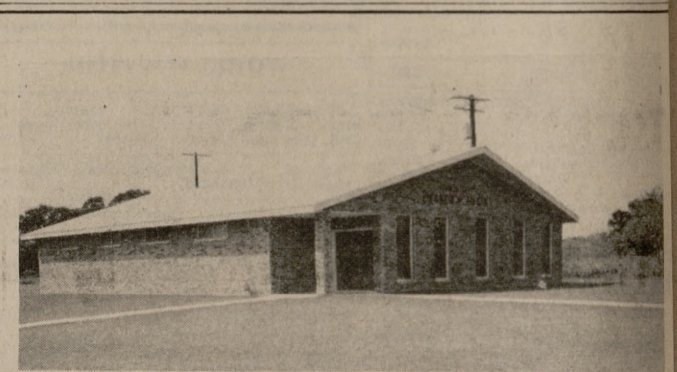

**BAPTISM IS IMMERSION**

Did you know that the standard authorities on the meaning of Greek terms inform us that baptism means immersion, not sprinkling or pouring? This is important because the New Testament Scriptures were written in the Greek language.

The Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament, by J. H. Thayer, defines "baptism" as meaning "immersion, submersion" (p. 94). A Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament and Other Early Christian Literature, by W. F. Arndt and F. W. Gingrich, tells us that "baptize" means "dip, immerse, dip oneself, wash" (p. 132). These men were and are members of religious bodies which do not practice immersion, hence they have no bias in favor of it.

The word "baptism" is used today to mean sprinkling or pouring as well as immersion. But it is not used thus in the New Testament. This simply means that men have changed what God ordained. Are you following the word of God or the traditions of men in this matter?
