"Texas A&M has had two weeks to get it all back together following some tough losses," he said. "They have outstanding personnel and I know they will be ready to play us."

Last year, in what many felt was the worst game A&M had ever played in Lubbock, the Raiders won 28-0.

OU Sooners Have Respect For Underdog Longhorns

DALLAS (A)-For the first amassing victories over Utah time since 1963 Texas is an underdog to Oklahoma in their annual Red River Classic, and Sooner fullback Tim Welch doesn't believe the Longhorns are being given enough credit.

Second-ranked Oklahoma is a 21-point favorite over the 10thranked Longhorns in Saturday's 67th renewal of their blood-feud classic in the Cotton Bowl before a regional television audience. "I don't think people are tak-

tle. They've got as good a team as they've ever had." Welch, one of Oklahoma's many Texans, said he never thought about playing for the 'Horns: "They thought I was too little to play. I want to show them some-

ing them serious enough," Welch

Oklahoma has shown plenty in 48-27 victory in 1971.

State, Oregon and Clemson, outscoring the opposition 169-6. The Oklahoma defense has allowed no touchdowns and two field goals.

The Sooners lead the nation in total offense with 621 yards per game, rushing with 498.7 yards per game, and scoring with 56.3 points per contest.

Texas is also unbeaten, taking the measure of Miami, Texas Tech and Utah State.

Oklahoma and Texas have met one common opponent. The Sooners ripped Utah State 49-0 and Texas scored a 27-12 victory.

Oklahoma was No. 1 in the nation in 1963 and Texas was No. 2 when the teams met. The underdog Longhorns won and romped to the national title. The Sooners have been the underdogs every year since but registered a
