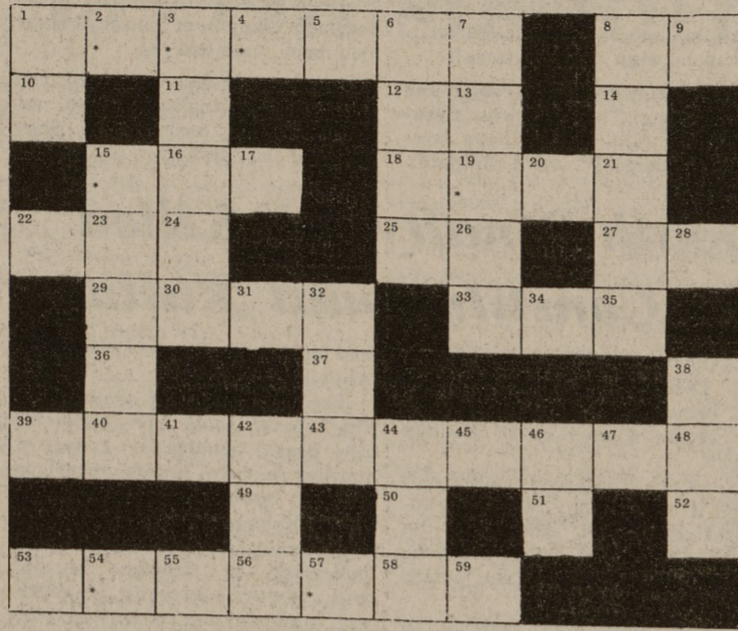

## McGovern Receives Warm Greeting At Texas Capitol

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP)—Sen. George McGovern received a tumultuous welcome in the Texas Capitol Monday, including the surprising cheers of some conservative Democratic legislators.

"That's the greatest reception I've seen here in 20 years," Rep. W. S. Healy of Paducah, flushed of face, told McGovern after the South Dakota senator addressed a joint session of the Legislature. Healy, until recently the powerful conservative chairman of the

House Appropriations Committee, stuck close to McGovern as they pushed slowly through the throngs in the Capitol halls.

Rep. Frances Farenthold of Corpus Christi, defeated liberal candidate for governor and a major McGovern supporter, was unable to get close to the Democratic presidential candidate as she and Healy and others in the official escort made their way into the packed House.

"Viva McGovern! Viva McGov-

ern!" shouted many in the crowd. Hands pushed at him from two and three ranks back. He stopped frequently to sign his name, smiling and nodding and shouting back at those who pleaded for his attention.

He received a standing ovation as he entered the House chamber, another when he was introduced and another when he finished a 20-minute speech that was interrupted 13 times by applause.

Many stood and cheered and

applauded after he said: "...better the obvious mistakes of honest leadership than the cold and apparently to sign his name, smiling and nodding and shouting back at those who pleaded for his attention.

Relatives and friends of legislators sat bunched beside representatives' desks. Scores of supporters stood out in the halls on the second and third floors. As many as could get into the press room stood around a loudspeaker to hear the speech.

## For Sale—Hughes Tool Co.

HOUSTON (AP)—Billionaire recluse Howard Hughes will sell the cornerstone of his financial empire, the Houston-based Hughes Tool Co., officials of the firm said Monday.

The company, which employs more than 3,000 persons, is the nation's largest manufacturer of oil and gas well drilling bits.

In the surprise move, Hughes Tool announced the filing of a registration statement with the Securities and Exchange Commission for a proposed offer of five million shares of common stock of a new company bearing the same name, which will acquire assets and business of the oil tool division of the Hughes empire.

A Hughes spokesman in Los Angeles said that Hughes, now residing in Nicaragua, will own no interest in Hughes Tool after the proposed offering.

Hughes has been the sole stockholder in the company, founded by his father on a revolutionary new oil well drilling bit the elder Hughes invented in 1909.

From this beginning, the company became the keystone of Hughes' subsequent ventures into airlines, movie making, aircraft manufacturing, mining properties, hotels and casinos in Nevada and substantial real estate holdings.

Hughes moved from Houston to California in the mid-1930s after acquiring the aircraft manufacturing firm and Trans World Airlines. He later sold Trans World but since has purchased Air West.

He also holds interest in airlines in Nicaragua and has announced plans to extend Air West operations in Vancouver, British Columbia.

Earlier this year, Hughes tried, and failed, to acquire Houston-based Texas International.

The proposed stock offering calculates the maximum offering price of the stock at \$28 per share, meaning Hughes could realize \$140 million from the sale.

According to information filed with the SEC, Hughes Tool netted

\$4.2 million in 1971 on sales of \$82 million.

The oil well bit which sent the Hughes fortune on its way has had worldwide use and the company has followed the policy of only renting and never selling the bit.

The proposal to make a public offering of the Hughes Tool Co. stock marks the first time that any of the Hughes holdings would be in the hands of the public.
