FRENCH ONION SOUP To make the soup, cut 5 medium-sized (1 lb.) dry onions into thin slices, heat in 3 tbsp. butter in a three-quart heavy pan until the onions are golden in color. Gradually blend in 11/2 quarts

bouillon, season with 1/2 tsp salt and 1/8 tsp pepper. Bring to boil, cover and simmer about 15 minutes.

"Again, if you were to travel in different countries, you would find fruits very popular as desserts; this is particularly true of countries in the Southern Hemisphere. Very often, the fruit is served alone, without any seasonings.

"In European countries, you would find dairy products used quite extensively, particularly cottage cheese and sour cream.

"In most countries, heavy or whipping cream is used in the dessert preparation, as is done in the Banana Fool, a favorite recipe from Africa.

BANANA FOOL 2 c. banana pulp 4 egg yolks, beaten 2 tbsp. maraschino cherry juice ½ c. heavy cream whipped 2 egg whites, beaten 2 tbsp. powdered sugar 1/8 tsp. grated nutmeg

Whip the banan pulp until smooth. Beat egg yolks until thick, add banana pulp and maraschino juice and beat well. Pour into sherbet glasses and chill. Before serving, whip cream and add some to each glass. Whip the egg whites with sugar and add some of this to each glass on top of the cream. Sprinkle a little nutmeg over the top. Serves 6.


