

Govern spelled out his "new internationalism," it seemed that he might offer voters a choice on America's role in world affairs. But no more. Except for Viet-

nam, the Senator now agrees with the President on the essentials of a bi-partisan internationlism. Here is how those essentials stack up:

Detente with China. McGovern promises to recognize Peking; Nixon would do the same. The logic is obvious, and extends well beyond opportunities for trade.

Ever since the Council on Foreign Relations sponsored its threeyear, 11-volume study of U. S .-China Relations (1962-65), policymakers have increasingly seen the advantage of working out accommodations with China to maintain the status quo in Asia.

Detente with Russia. Just as with China, both McGovern and Nixon would pursue rapprochement. McGovern, unlike Nixon, would cut back military spending. But that is less a shift in foreign policy than a move to trim the profits of domestic weapons pro-

Alliance with Japan and Western Europe. Both McGovern and Nixon would continue to move Washington down from its former perch as the leader of "the free world" to a position as "first

Martinez described LSD as the most frightening drug of them


"It is highly hallucinogenic and can cause flashbacks as much as six months later," he said. He added that only an ounce of it can produce as much as 300,000 "hits." Because of its small size it often passes undetected into the Huntsville prison through the mail by way of the backs of stamps and on the letters themselves, he said.
