Mortar Board A&M has established a senior women's honor society, "Cap and Gown," which will coordinate efforts for the next five years to gain a chapter of Mortar Board on the campus.

Mrs. Patricia A. Self, counselor for women, said the local society will be based on Mortar Board standards with the national organization examining progress.

"Thirty-five senior women will be selected within the next two weeks for initiation Dec. 3. Junior women will be initiated next spring for senior membership during the 1973-74 academic year," Mrs. Self said.

Women must have a minimum 3.0 grade point ratio for all semesters preceding election, plus outstanding leadership and unselfish service records, she pointed out.

"All senior women who are eligible were sent forms to indicate if they desired membership. The returned forms will be screened by a five-member committee," Mrs. Self said.

Beverly Braley will provide the outfits to be modeled by the Mam'selles. Fall and winter fashions geared to the college student will be presented.


