## Bonfire First Aid Examination Qualifying Date Announced

If you are enthusiastic about Bonfire but tired of the blisters and coffee routine, why not try working on the first aid team? This group is not male chauvinistic in nature, it welcomes all qualified personnel who are willing to work. It is amazing how the healing hands of a sweet young thing can put the zing back into the body of the weary worker. Those who are interested can drop by the Physics Building any time between 7-9 p.m. Thursday evening. A qualifying examination will be given in room 305 during those hours. Bring a pencil and extra paper. If there is conflict contact Will Way or Lauro Cuellar.

The quiz will be a brief essay and listing format. Knowledge of treatments for the various types of fractures, cuts, burns, treatment for sprains, strains, shock, heat prostration and exhaustion, particles in the eyes, and splinters and other occupational hazards indigenous to the Bonfire worker will be required. Students who have taken the first aid course offered by the P.E. department, or who hold a Red Cross Card are well qualified to take the exam. (Which is not tricky, chicken, or picky.) This exam is required every year regardless of your qualifications or past experience, as any veteran crew member can tell you. The crews will work in 6-8 hour shifts. There will be first aid squads at both cutting and stacking areas.

## A&M Gains Mortar Board

A&M has established a senior women's honor society, "Cap and Gown," which will coordinate efforts for the next five years to gain a chapter of Mortar Board on the campus. Mrs. Patricia A. Self, counselor for women, said the local society will be based on Mortar Board standards with the national organization examining progress.

"Thirty-five senior women will be selected within the next two weeks for initiation Dec. 3. Junior women will be initiated next spring for senior membership during the 1973-74 academic year," Mrs. Self said. Women must have a minimum 3.0 grade point ratio for all semesters preceding election, plus outstanding leadership and selfless service records, she pointed out.

"All senior women who are eligible were sent forms to indicate if they desired membership. The returned forms will be screened by a five-member committee," Mrs. Self said. Committee members are Dean of Women Toby Schreiber; Dr. Betty M. Unterberger, professor of history; Mrs. Carolyn Adair, Memorial Student Center employee and Mortar Board member; Miss Judith McConnell, graduate student and Gilbert E. Mayuex, assistant professor of modern languages.
