Trudeau Faces Parliament Despite Electoral Setback

OTTAWA (AP) - Pierre Elliott somehow get away with it." Trudeau said Thursday night his Liberal government will stay on and face Parliament despite the stunning electoral setback that chopped away his majority.

The prime minister acknowledged in a television news conference that his Liberals' showing in the Monday elections "reflected the view of a good many Canadians that the government for the last 41/2 years has not been satisfactory.

"The continuation of my government will depend on the Parliament." he said.

Processing of election results developed Thursday into a tie between the Liberal and Conservative parties at 109 seats each in the House of Commons, with recounts still under way in several tight races.

The balance in the 264-member house is held by the socialistic New Democrats, with 30 seats.

David Lewis, the New Democrat party leader, pledged his support for the Liberal government on condition that the government does not introduce legislation the New Democrats cannot

Lewis, in a news conference held after Trudeau's, said the New Democrats would not seek to obstruct Parliament and throw the country into new elections, but he added that no Canadian believes the new Parliament can last a full term of four years.

Robert Stanfield, the Conservative leader, sharply criticized Trudeau's decision.

"Mr. Trudeau made it clear tonight the arrogant desire of his government to hang on to power," Stanfield said. "He is treating the election results as simply another opinion poll in the hope he can


