One student went to the extent of outlining a method to control campus traffic which included the use of guard sations to keep cars off-campus in a closed campus situation.

As part of this brief survey, The Battalion went to Student Government President Layne Kruse for a general explanation of the Senate, its purposes and its functions.

"The Student Government provides two basic functions," began Kruse in his outline. "First, it does what its name implies - it governs. Secondly, it works to provide services to the students which are not normally given to them.

"Over-all, the student government is an integral part of the university."

Kruse pointed out there are two methods of representation. This includes the fifty senators chosen by apportionment in the various colleges and the senators repreon- and off-campus.




