European Winter Holiday Offered By Travel Committee

A "Europe winter holiday" at Courchevel, France, will be offered by the Memorial Student Center Travel Committee during the semester break at the same price as the Colorado ski trip. Courchevel, the most modern and extensively developed ski area in Europe, encompasses five towns on different levels in one complex. Once a pasture that only goats and sheep knew about, the area has been developed into 62 miles of interconnecting trails with runs from beginner's to expert's with intermediate runs from top to bottom. The trails are a ski equivalent of Venice's canals. Everywhere, guests can ski down or ride back up practically to the door of their hotels. One can reach distant lifts by skiing over or hail an Air Alps plane.

Courchevel, one of the most cosmopolitan of French resorts, is sometimes referred to as a carnival. After skiing, on terraces of every mountain cafe and restaurant, there is outdoor dining and dining before the nightly round of some 16 discotheques. Other day or night non-ski attractions include skating, torchlight descents, swimming, shopping and late night fondue parties atop a mountain. A&M students will be lodged in modern chalets and apartments during their stay in Courchevel. On the next to last day of their trip they will depart for Paris in the morning for a day of sight-seeing. After a night's wind-up fling in Paris, the students will depart for the U.S.A. the next morning.

In announcing the tour, the Travel Committee said that eligibility for the university promoted trip is limited to A&M students, staff, faculty, former students and their immediate family.

A&M is presenting the tour in coordination with Group Travel Associates of Chicago, Illinois. G.T.A., fully licensed and bonded

by the Air Traffic Conference of America and the International Air Travel Association, specializes in the area of servicing colleges and universities. Over a nine year period, G.T.A. has developed systems to operate large numbers of group flights.

The joint effort of the MSC Travel Committee and G.T.A. will enable students to enjoy a tailored travel program without most of the risks involved in group travel as it relates to the college campus. Air transportation will be via Air France regular scheduled airline departing from Houston on Jan. 1 and returning on Jan. 13.

One student went to the extent of outlining a method to control campus traffic which included the use of guard stations to keep cars off-campus in a closed campus situation.

As part of this brief survey, The Battalion went to Student Government President Layne Kruse for a general explanation of the Senate, its purposes and its functions.

"The Student Government provides two basic functions," began Kruse in his outline. "First, it does what its name implies — it governs. Secondly, it works to provide services to the students which are not normally given to them."

"Over-all, the student government is an integral part of the university."

Kruse pointed out there are two methods of representation. This includes the fifty senators chosen by apportionment in the various colleges and the senators representing the various living areas on- and off-campus.

He said the primary duty of the senator was to represent his constituents.

"Of course there are two ways a senator can do this," he continued. "One, he can go directly to the student and ask their opinion on various matters. On the other hand, he may represent his constituents by just being in the same environment, participating in the same programs and running up against the same type problems."

"If the Senate did not exist, a lot of services such as refrigerators, Free University, Fair Housing Commission, Day Care Center and the like would be curtailed."

"Of course it wouldn't be necessary to have these things such as representation, student reforms and other changes made by student in-put, but I think this would be a great loss to the university and its students," concluded Kruse.
