Second Discrimination Suit Filed Against Uvalde School System

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP)—U.S. District Court Judge John Wood took under advisement Wednesday a second suit assailing policies of the Uvalde school system toward Mexican-Americans.

Wood took testimony briefly from Josue Garza, a Crystal City elementary principal who has lodged a complaint of discrimination in connection with his 1970 dismissal as a Uvalde teacher.

Most of the court record of the Garza case is contained in depositions and records of previous hearings concerning Garza.

Wood gave plaintiff's attorneys seven days to file a brief and another seven for the defendants to answer. No decision was made on whether final arguments would be necessary in the case, which was heard without a jury.

Garza's dismissal was followed by a walkout of Mexican-American pupils at the end of the spring 1970 term in Uvalde.

Wood has under advisement a suit filed by Genoveva Morales, a mother of eleven children. Testimony in her case concluded Tuesday and Wood gave her attorneys 10 days to file a brief. Uvalde school officials have another 10 days in which to answer, preparatory to a judgment by Wood.

Garza testified in the Morales case that he knows five teachers in Crystal City who were unable to find teaching jobs in their hometown of Uvalde.

Uvalde school officials say they fill teaching positions on the basis of the best qualified persons available at the time.

In the Morales case, an official of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare testified HEW had determined discrimination exists in the Uvalde school system against Mexican-American pupils. Uvalde officials deny the charge.

Four Nations Grant U.S. VN Cease-Fire Support

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States has received what it regards as agreement in principle from Canada, Indonesia, Hungary and Poland to participate in a Vietnam cease-fire, a State Department spokesman said Wednesday.

Details were still sketchy on how the operation will be worked out.

Press officer Charles W. Bray indicated that the United States could provide at least some of the logistic support for inspectors from the four nations to oversee the truce when it is agreed upon.

Also, Bray did not rule out logistic support from other coun-

tries and from the four nations themselves.

According to diplomatic sources the inspection teams will include 250 officers and 1,000 men from each of the four nations, making a total of 5,000 inspectors.

To their operations will be added the mixed teams of the South Vietnamese army and Viet Cong and other teams that will include representatives of the United States and North Vietnam as well as Saigon and Viet Cong.

In Ottawa, a spokesman for the Canadian Foreign Office said Canada has made no commitment for a new truce supervision role. He said he assumed Bray's announcement indicated acceptance of Canada's Nov. 2 offer to make available its 19-member International Control Commission delegation already in Vietnam.

Houston Police Chief Herman Short and Police Capt. Jack Reinos, head of the narcotics division, said they were aware that the IRS was investigating members of the department.

Reinos said he understood that the IRS investigation was "just a salary thing." He refused to identify the officers.

Short said the IRS had notified him that Houston officers were being investigated but he said nothing about any "take" was mentioned.

"Those two people (the un-

identified officers) are about as broke as anyone I know of," Short said. "A lot of people's returns are checked for one thing or another."

In his testimony at a preliminary hearing for Mirelez on charges of evading more than \$100,000 in federal income taxes, Hollenshead said his informant told him he saw Mirelez give the officers the \$190,000 as "protection payment" in 1966. He testified Mirelez had "nondeductible expenditures of \$235,972 in 1966.

Pressed for a breakdown of the total amount, Hollenshead said

some of the money was spent for furniture and a car but that \$190,000 went to narcotics officers as protection payments.

At the preliminary hearing, an attorney for Mirelez asked for the names of the narcotics agents Mirelez allegedly paid off.

However, a U.S. magistrate ruled out that line of questioning and the IRS agent did not answer the question.

Mirelez has had numerous arrests and convictions since 1949 on narcotics charges. He has served time in the federal penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kan.
