Gadd Tops Ferguson
SWC's Leading Passer Guides Rice At Ags

The Southwest Conference's leading passing team in the Rice Owls invade Kyle Field to do battle with the Texas Aggies Saturday afternoon at 1:30.

The Owls are sporting a new coach, their third one in as many years, in Al Conover. Conover was a member of Bill Peterson's staff before taking the head coaching job when Peterson switched to the Houston Oilers.

The Owls have 42 returning lettermen from last year's 3-7-1 squad and looked like they might be a contender for the conference crown after the first four games of the season.

Rice beat arch-rival University of Houston 14-13 in their opener and then whipped Clemson 29-10. The Owls then tied an excellent Georgia Tech team 36-36 before falling to powerful LSU 12-6.

Rice has since fallen upon harder times. They lost to SMU on regional TV 29-14, Texas 45-9 and Texas Tech 10-6. The Owls ended their skid by upsetting Arkansas 23-20 last Saturday in Little Rock, running their record to 3-4-1.

The Rice offense sports conference leading performers in three categories. Quarterback Bruce Gadd is the

conference's leading passer with 127 completions in 239 attempts. Gadd has thrown eight touchdown passes and is completing 53 percent of his tosses. He has suffered 17 interceptions.

Gadd is also the leader in total offense with over 30 yards a contest. His performance this year places him ahead of the heralded Joe Ferguson of Arkansas.

Rice also has the leading receivers in the conference. Tight-end Gary Butler and freshman split receiver Edwin Collins both have 33 receptions this season.

Rice runs its offense from a spread-pro-style formation and throws the ball about half the

time. Gadd is joined in the backfield by halfback Gary Ferguson, fullback John Coleman and slot receiver Ron Arceneaux. Ferguson is the leading ball carrier with 405 yards and is the third receiver on the talented passing team with 19 receptions.

The Rice offensive line has Ron Waedemon and Sammy Johnson at the tackles, Bart Goforth and David Vandiver at the guard spots and Tommy Godard at center.

Where the Rice offense is leading the conference in passing, the defense is the cellar-dweller in a few categories.

The Owls are on the bottom of the pile in total defense and in

defending against the rush. The game pits strength against strength and weakness against weakness as the Aggies are last in total offense in the conference but have one of the outstanding defensive units in the SWC.

The Rice defense lines up with Larry Walling and Larry Medford at ends with Cornelius Walker, Aggie running back Skip Walker's big brother and Jody Medford at the tackle spots.

Rice has had some problems with injuries at the linebacker positions but all are healthy for the Aggies.

Rodrigo Barnes, who missed three games due to a bruised kidney, plugs the middle. John Kelly and David Snellings guard the outside.

Preston Anderson is the Rice monster man.

The Owls pass defense, shut out Joe Ferguson with three completions for 37 yards. Don Bernshausen and Clay Culpepper at the corners and Bruce Henley in the safety positions. Henley is tied for the conference lead in interceptions with four.

Staubach Will Enter Game When Dallas Win Assured

DALLAS (AP)—Dallas Cowboy Coach Tom Landry said Wednesday he wanted to clear up any misunderstanding he might have with the news media on backup quarterback Roger Staubach's status.

Landry said recent quotes attributed to him made it "appear Roger was not a winner. I was just trying to make the point that the game ought to be under control before he plays."

Staubach has not played a down since he returned to the lineup following shoulder surgery. Quarterback Craig Morton has taken the team to a 7-2 record.

Landry said when Staubach came back that the situation would have to be "disastrous" before he played the hero of Super Bowl VI.

"If we had to go with Roger, there's no question of my confidence in him," Landry said.

"Roger might be rusty but he would still win the game."

The last two weeks Staubach has warmed up to go into the San Diego and St. Louis games as the Cowboys built big leads. However, Landry scrapped plans to send him in after the Chargers and Cardinals rallied to make the games close.

The defending Super Bowl champions meet Philadelphia Sunday and Landry said "The next

11 days are very critical for us." The Cowboys meet San Francisco Thanksgiving Day after the Eagle game.
