



Vietnamese Leaders Prepare For **Economic Crisis After Cease-Fire**

SAIGON (AP) - South Vietnamese government officials and business leaders are preparing detailed recommendations to cope with any financial or economic crisis following a cease-fire.

motto of the top-level effort is "be prepared" for everything and then hope that nothing happens. "Our immediate objective is to

maintain stability and maintain confidence," said one planner. "After a cease-fire, the most crucial time is the first three months as far as finance and economics is concerned," he continued. "If there is confidence after three months, then confidence

will build up." The planners explained they are working under the assumption that there will be a high degree of uncertainty in people's minds after a ceasefire announce-

ment and possibly in the government itself. The planning is a joint effort

of the Ministries of Economics, Finance and Planning and the National Bank with about 15 businessmen sitting in on various Vietnamese planners said the meetings and offering sugges-The planners have set up six

committees whose names spell out the major postwar economic concerns of the Saigon government: stabilization, human resources mobilization, credit, monetary and banking problems, foreign trade, foreign aid and investment, reconstruction and development and taxation and finance.

In the next few weeks, each committee composed of several government experts and two or three businessmen will be meeting and considering research and position papers and captured Communist documents.


