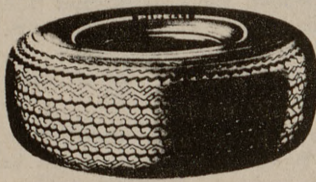

**Aggies Start Busy Week Here Tonight**

A&M starts a busy week of basketball when they tip off with the UT Arlington Mavericks tonight at 7:30 in G. Rollie White Coliseum.

After a weekend furlough, A&M then faces Angelo State Monday and George Washington University Wednesday. Both games are in G. Rollie White and both start at 7:30 p.m.

The Aggies are fresh off an impressive win over Wayland Baptist College and enthusiasm

about the team's possibilities abounds.

UTA presents more formidable opposition for the Aggies than Wayland Baptist. The Mavericks return seven lettermen from last year's 14-12 club, which posted the school's second winning season since becoming a senior college in 1959.

UTA lost its opener to a strong Oklahoma City University team, 82-81.

Returning starters Larry Moore and Perry Littleton hold down the post positions for the Mavs.

They are joined in the starting line-up by freshman Rickey Hughes and seniors Larry Hughes and Bill Barnett. Hughes led Chicago high schools in scoring last year with a 28.6 average.

The Aggies will again have a decided height advantage as they did against Wayland when they set a rebound mark by collecting 76 wayward shots.

Monday night, Angelo State presents a similar situation to UTA. They also return seven lettermen and finished with a 14-13 season last year.

The Aggies will counter with a lineup that has considerable depth and size.

Coach Shelby Metcalf cleared his bench in hunting for the exact combination needed for conference competition. He is giving all his players valuable experience and little effectiveness seemed lost in the changes.

Starting at the point for the Aggies tonight will be colorful playmaker Mario Brown.

The teams leading rebounder Randy Knowles and leading scorer Chuck Tone man the forward

spots for the Aggies, with Mercer and Jeff Overhouse at post positions.

The Aggies have excellent line reserves in talented sophomore Cedric Joseph and junior C. W. Guthrie. Joseph Overhouse both had 14 rebounds against Wayland following Knowles' 19.

Co-captain Bob Gobin, who slowed with a broken hand, shooting junior Wayne Eason and sophs Mike Floyd and Williams round out the roster.

Georgia Tech 21, Georgia 14: The red clay will fly. As Eddie McAshan goes, so goes Tech. McAshan should have a good day.

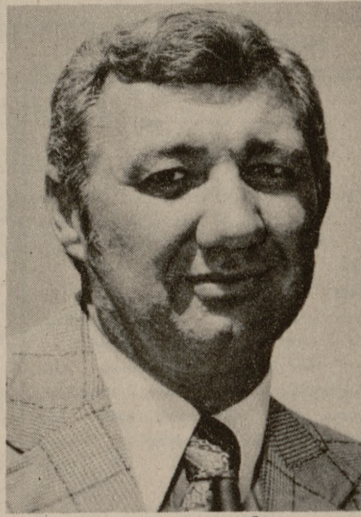
Alabama 28, Auburn 13: For the proud Bear Bryant and his Red Elephants, it's no fun being No. 2. An extra effort.

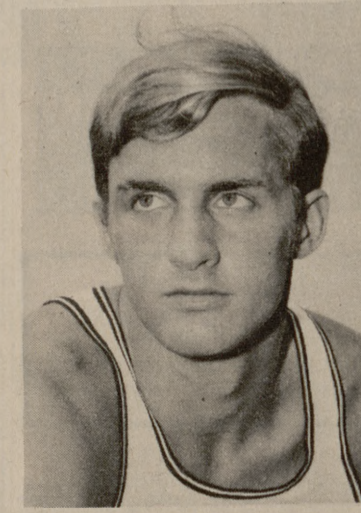

**Morris Says He May Not Play In '73**

DALLAS (AP) — Wayne Morris, the freshman Southern Methodist fullback who is the fifth highest ground gainer in the Southern Conference with one game to go, says playing as a freshman such a strain he may not continue his football career.

"I'm debating over what to do about next year," Morris told Dallas Morning News. "My studies have suffered this year, though they are at the critical point."

"I don't know whether to vote all my time to my studies next year or come back and play football."

Morris said he wants to do "a lot of people" before deciding about his football career and "If I had it all to do over again I wouldn't want to play as a freshman."

Morris, a blue chipper at South Oak Cliff High School in Dallas, has gained 827 yards in 168 carries as a Southwest Conference beginner.

"It's been hard for me to adjust to the new system. I've had to adjust to blocking more, running and I'm primarily a running back. I don't enjoy blocking that much more than running. I've become frustrated."

Coach Hayden Fry said he has not discussed Morris' future with him but said the first year is the most difficult for any student.

"Once you get by your first year, it's not so difficult," Fry said. "I think Wayne will find his sophomore year easier than this year."
