WASHINGTON (AP)-President Nixon Monday disclosed he will be held with people from labor, seek extension of wage-price controls beyond their April 30 expiration date and will freeze new hiring and promotions as well as pay increases for executives in the federal government.

Treasury Secretary George P. Shultz made known the longawaited presidential decision on continuation of the wage-price control system now slightly more than a year old. But the secretary said consultations will begin immediately to determine how the Conrad Dudek later that evening. control system will be changed.

Nixon has also decided that he can, and is determined to, hold federal spending in the current fiscal year to \$250 billion, Shultz said. This would be accomplished by cutting back spending through withholding money appropriated by Congress.

**Nixon To Extend Wage-Price Controls** 

The freeze on new federal hiring and promotions will last until the new budget is sent to Congress in January, Shultz said, and will be accompanied by very substantial cuts in the White House staff.

Shultz said the freeze on pay increases for federal executives applies not only to the executive branch, but to Congress and to the federal judiciary as well. He said it would last through

# Judge Declares Mistrial **In Pentagon Papers Case**

LOS ANGELES (AP)-The judge we had to go to trial with a jury in the Pentagon papers trial declared a mistrial Monday after defendants Daniel Ellsberg and Anthony Russo waived protection against double jeopardy in order to obtain a new jury and a fresh start.

The defense then raised an objection concerning the potential jury panel, saying the chief judge of the district may have prejudiced any prospective jurors. The declaration of mistrial and

order for a new jury by U.S. District Court Judge Matt Byrne technically placed the defendants in double jeopardy because a second trial was ordered without completion of a first. However, Ellsberg and Russo announced in court that they would waive protection against prosecution twice on the same charges in order to start anew with the fresh jurors.

Their attorneys had contended that the jurors, who were sent home for four months while appeals were taken to higher courts, were prejudiced by publicity during the hiatus.

Ellsberg, 41, and Russo, 35, both former researchers on government projects, are charged with espionage, conspiracy and theft in connection with the leak to news media of top-secret documents detailing origins of the Vietnam war.

Byrne, saying he would formally dismiss jurors on Tuesday, noted that a new panel would be available for questioning on Wednesday and indicated he hoped to start then. He said he did not expect testimony to begin before January.

The previous jury selection took about three weeks.
