Senate Defies Republicans On Watergate Issue

ate Wednesday rejected Republican attempts to broaden the scope and revise the membership of a proposed special committee to investigate the Watergate bugging incident.

The proposal stems from the bugging and break-in at the Democratic party's Watergate building offices last June.

GOP senators said the Democrats were seeking to cover up their own misdeeds by confining the probe to the 1972 election, saying, without citing specifics, that the Democrats had bugged them in the 1964 and 1968 cam-
