The bill, sponsored by Sen. Jack political subdivisions construct pollution control facilities through the use of tax-exempt bonds, and then lease or sell the facilities to industry.

Industry could claim investment tax credits and normal depreciation allowances, but would be required to pay ad valorem taxes on the facilities, whether they owned them or leased them.

"It's simply a way by which business and industry can finance control facilities," said Hightower, noting such a plan already exists in Texas for water pollution control.

He said 30 other states have

such an arrangement. "If we fail to pass this bill we're not permitting our industry to be competitive."

Wade Spillman, speaking for the Municipal Advisory Council of Texas, said the measure would "facilitate earlier compliance with air control standards."

"It's whole purpose is to aid business and industry in Texas," Spillman said.

The measure was changed to exclude water districts but include multi-county districts in financing the bonds, on a suggestion by Jack Davis, general manager of the Gulf Coast Waste Disposal Authority. Also included other political subdivisions.


