

by Panama, Guinea, Peru, Sudan, Yugoslavia, Kenya, India and Indochina. Panama demands control over the canal that was built through its territory by the United States early in this century. Council President Aquilino Boyd, the Panamanian envoy to the United Nations, called for a vote with a show of hands.

The resolution on which the 15nation council voted was a watered-down version of the original submitted by Panama. Britain abstained in the vote.

The United States previously has used its veto power in the council to block a proposal for severing all communications with the white minority government cf Rhodesia in 1970 and a Mideast resolution in September 1972 directed against Israel.

The meeting in Panama, which began last Thursday, was the Security Council's first in Latin America. Brig. Gen. Omar Torrijos, the Panamanian leader, invited the council to meet here to attract world attention to Panama's dispute with Washington over the U.S.-run canal.
