"THE CHIEF OF SINNERS"

Kent Ellis, Evangelist "THE CHIEF OF SINNERS" If you were asked to describe the very worst type of sinner, what sort of person would come to your mind? I think most would conceive of an irreligious, immoral individual, without principles or conscience. I would certainly agree that such a person would be a great sinner, indeed. But the man who describes himself in the Bible as the chief of sinners was not that kind of man at all. The Apostle Paul worte "that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners; of whom I am chief" (I Tim. 1:15). He had reference to his career prior to believing and obeying Christ. At the time Paul said he was chief of sinners, he was (1) a conscientious man. He had a good and pure conscience, doing what he thought was right (Acts 23:1; II Tim. 1:3; Acts 26:9). In most respects, he was (2) a moral man. He said that "touch-ing the righteousness which is in the law," he was "found blame-less" (Phil. 3:6). This would include the moral precepts of the ten commandments and the remainder of the Mosaic law. His statement must be modified by the part he played in the persecu-tion and death of Christians. But, even in this, he undoubtedly thought he was doing God's service (John 16:2). Above all, he was (3) a devout and zealous religious man (Acts 26:5; Gal. 1:14). More, he was a successful, influential, religious leader. How-ver, his religious zeal was not employed in doing God's righteous-ness, but "for the traditions" of his fathers. Wy should a conscientious, moral, religious man be called this for sinners? The sins Paul lists in the context of I Timothy 1:5 are "religious" sins—blasphemy, persecution, injury to the opposition to Christ, His will, and His people than any other type of sin. The more zealous and successful a religious leader is who follows the traditions of men, rather than the word of God, the nore effective he is against the cause of Christ and the souls of ment the more is not a matter of indifference nor a further the sould be since the distinged be the mor

Religious error is not a matter of indifference nor a harm-Religious error is not a matter of indifference nor a harm-less thing. Being religious is not equal to being righteous. The New Testament is full of examples of people who were religious. but lost. The aim of true evangelism is not to get the irreligious to be religious. It is to convince all, both religious and irreligious, to believe and to do exactly what God requires of them. Paul remained guilty of the chief of sins until he did. As a believing, pentitent individual, he was commanded to "arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord,, (Acts 22:16). No person should take comfort in his spiritual state— even if he is conscientious, moral, and religious—until he has done likewise. done likewise.
