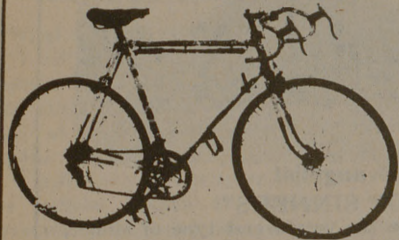

Courson, Lomax Win Doubles

Tennis Team Third At Rice

A&M's tennis team finished a surprising third in the 15th annual Rice Collegiate Invitational Tennis Tournament in Houston last weekend.

The rain-delayed tournament sported 25 teams including nine of the top 18 teams in the country.

SMU won the tournament with 15 points, followed by Corpus

Christi with 11 and A&M, Rice and the University of Houston with 10 points.

The Aggies were paced in their efforts by Dan Courson and Carter Lomax who teamed to win the doubles event.

Courson and Lomax were unseeded among the tough competition and their win was the first

doubles victory of any school except Trinity, Corpus or Rice in the tournament's history.

Bill Hoover and Bill Wright also had a successful tournament for the Aggies, winning their first two single matches and gaining spots in the top 16 singles players in the tourney.

Some 130 players participated

in the event which was held on Rice's Jake Hess Tennis Stadium.

Coach Omar Smith was elated over the performance of the team in what he called "the toughest intercollegiate tournament in the country."

"The whole team worked hard to give a good showing at a major tournament," Smith said. "This was a real big win for us." The Aggies' next tennis action is Friday and Saturday when they host Stephen F. Austin and LSU on Varsity Courts at 1:30 p.m.

Ags Rained Out With Rice, Host Minnesota Today

The rain-plagued Texas Aggie baseball team tries to get back on the field as Minnesota visits Kyle Field for 1 p.m. double-headers today and Wednesday.

A&M has played 10 games this season posting a 7-3 mark and having seven contests called due to the weather.

Last weekend's Southwest Conference series with Rice was cancelled and under conference rules cannot be rescheduled.

The conference crown is determined on a won-loss percentage basis.

Minnesota is 3-3 on the season having dropped two games yesterday to Texas 3-2 and 13-8.

The rainout with Rice gives the Aggies a chance to heal some sore arms and pulled muscles but coach Tom Chandler feels his forces need to play.

"When we came back from Florida we were at our peak,"

Chandler explained, "but we just haven't been able to stay there because of the rain. We have had over two weeks of action rained out and it will start to effect our play if we don't get in some ball games."

The series with Minnesota is the last non-conference action for the Aggies this season.
