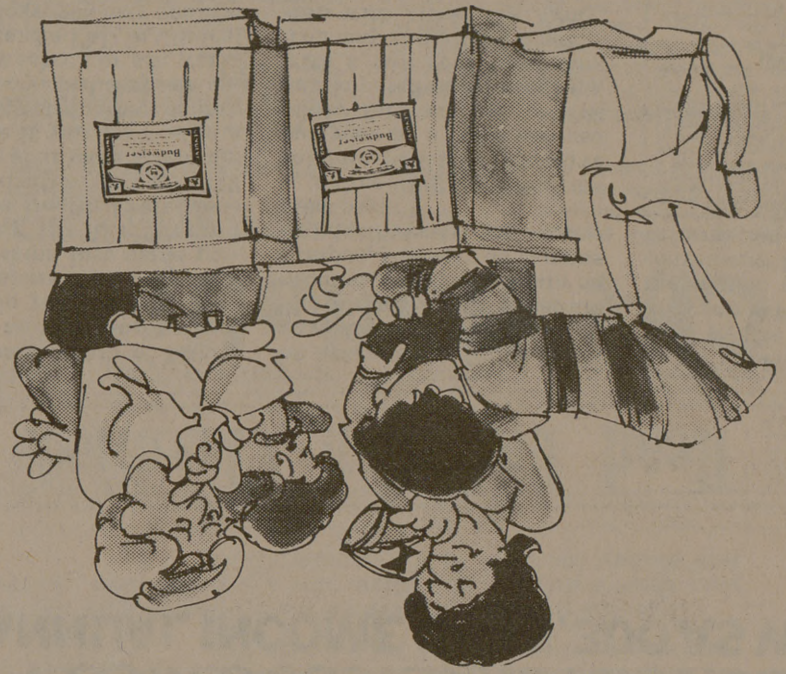


ANSWER: Since both boxes are exactly the same size, the size or cost of the bottles makes little difference. The full box is worth more than the half-full box because it contains twice as much. WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Sam J. Ervin Jr., D-N.C., Monday rejected the Watergate staff investigation of the Senate's identical aides in the Senate's inquiry to obtain special treatment for presidential aides in the Senate's investigation.
