**Bill Would Allow 16-Year-Old Girls To Get Contraceptives With Consent**

AUSTIN (AP) — Girls 16 and older could get contraceptive information and devices from doctors with parental consent under a bill approved Wednesday by a House subcommittee.

The subcommittee, however, put off action on sterilization and abortion bills for at least a week. Rep. Tim Von Dohlen, D-Goliad, said he wanted time to perfect a substitute bill that would outlaw abortion in state-licensed and tax-supported hospitals and make it murder to abort a fetus that had been carried 18 weeks or longer.

A 5 to 1 subcommittee vote

sent the contraceptive bill to the full House Human Resources Committee for further action.

It would permit a woman between 16 and 21 to receive pregnancy care and contraceptive measures from a physician without the doctor having to get the consent of her parents, as present law requires.

Girls under 16 also could receive such care without parental permission if they were living away from home or their parents could not be located.

A doctor could tell a girl's parent he had treated her for pregnancy or prescribed birth control

measures if he thought this would "benefit the health of the minor patient."

Rep. Chris Miller, D-Fort Worth, tried to require the minor's consent before her parents could be informed, but was outvoted 4-1.

"We are symbolically saying that we recognize the solidity of the family but we also recognize there are some problems," said Rep. Lyndon Olson, D-Waco, who opposed Ms. Miller's amendment.

Rep. Ben T. Reyes, D-Houston, tried to strike a provision allowing a doctor or other person to refuse on religious grounds to provide contraceptive measures.

"I don't think you should have a religious reason. If we start getting into that we'll be starting to legislate morals," Reyes said. "It is a person's right to have that professional right at this time," said Von Dohlen, a Roman Catholic.

Reyes' amendment was tabled 4-1.

The sterilization bill provides that a doctor would not be liable for damages if he sterilized a man or woman without his or her spouse's consent.

The subcommittee deadlocked 3-3 on motions to table the measure and to send it to the full committee. Rep. Eddie Bernice Johnson, D-Dallas, the chairman, did not vote, leaving the tie intact.

Rep. Tom Schieffer, D-Fort Worth, disagreed with assertions

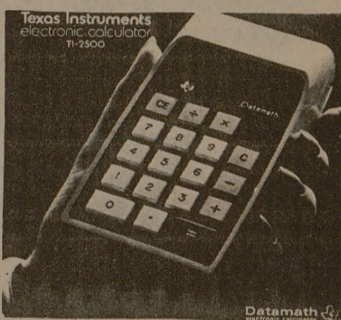
that such legislation is needed by persons who are separated from their spouses or have been deserted.

"We have a remedy through the courts for divorce. I think the common law which requires consent of the spouse is correct in this area. The marriage contract is such that it requires consent of both persons," Schieffer said.

Von Dohlen's proposed abortion law apparently would leave physicians free to perform abortions in their own offices or clinics. But it would add considerable red tape, including mandatory reports to the State Health Department.

Saline injection and hysterotomies—surgical removal of a fetus—would be prohibited.

If an aborted fetus was living when removed, a doctor would have to notify the State Board of Health and obtain a birth certificate for it. The fetus automatically would be determined to be a "dependent and neglected child" and the state attorney general would be required to seek out proper care for it.

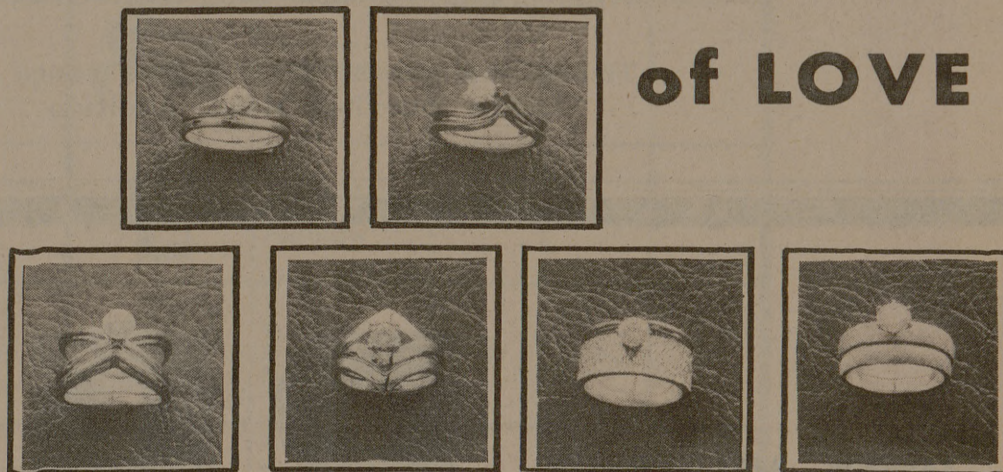
