## House Committee Issues Report On Sharpstown Caper

AUSTIN (A)-The House Genral Investigating Committee issued its long-awaited report on he Sharpstown scandal Thursday and said it was "regrettable" that Houston promoter Frank Sharp was granted immunity from rosecution.

No conclusions were reached the 13-page report about whether there was any misconduct in connection with passage of two banking bills sought by harp in 1969.

Mutscher said the day he was indicted that "the big fish are still swimming." A federal judge granted Sharp immunity from prosecution in return for his testimony to a federal grand jury.

Committee members also referred to the defeat of representatives who had not joined in the legislative attack on Mutscher.

It was a pity, the report said, "that the cloak of suspicion was improperly and unfairly thrown over the shoulders of several honorable and hard-working members of the House, resulting in their loss to the State of Texas."

Each of the investigating committee members was appointed by Mutscher and each was a standing committee chairman, selected by the former speaker, in the 1971 legislature.
