In testimony prepared for the Oil Policy Committee Hearings, W. T. Slick, Jr., senior vice president of Exxon USA, said "Exxon USA is quite concerned not only over the ability of the consumer to obtain needed supplies but also that ways be found to guard against unreasonable increases in prices that can develop in times of tight supply. Motor gasoline prices have already shown some tendency to increase in isolated

Slick pointed out that present price controls apply to only the 23 largest petroleum companies, and apply primarily at the whole-

"Generally speaking, these 23 companies have little control over retail prices," he explained. "For example, Exxon products are sold in about 25,000 service stations, but Exxon itself only operates about 1,000 of these. We have no control over prices in stations we do not operate."

"In the interest of protecting the consumer and controlling inflation, we believe the time has come for the Cost of Living Counto the need or desirability of imposing price controls on petroleum products at the retail level for so long as other controls on the economy are necessary. Such controls should include all service station gasoline, home heating oil

But he said tle company has concluded that energy shortages

this summer may be scattered, temporary, and, n total, relatively minor. "Looking beyond this summer, shortages are likely to occur in

the next three tofour years which could go well beyond the consumer inconvenence level that could develop his summer. In that event, government may well have to take sronger measures. But a significant amount of planning will be required to ensure that such measures are effective,"

"One of the unique roles for the Federal Overnment is the establishment of priorities for supplying various consuming sectors in the erent of shortages of essential gods and services. These judgments should not be

— or, for that matter, to s pliers."

"Government may find it nece sary to impose a system of man datory regulations to assure th essential or priority needs met. Mandatory controls wo be a very drastic measure. therefore urge that, if they deemed by government to be no essary, an opportunity for revi and comment be afforded to bot consumers and suppliers before regulations are finally adopted, Slick said.

Most importantly, he added the overriding concern which should guide the handling of the tee on Sch supply situation by both govern with the ment and industry is the wellbeing of the consumer who, in the final analysis, is the one wh stands to suffer or gain the most
