

Swim Club Wins 36 Medals In Houston

The College Station Swim Club brought back 36 medals from the AAU-sanctioned Meyerland Swim Meet in Houston over the weekend.

CSSC was competing without its top-ranked swimmer, Bob Leland, who was entered in the Santa Clara International. His brother, Bill Leland, com-

ped one of the club's six first-place medals at the meet at Meyerland Country Club, winning the "B" Division 100-meter breast stroke for senior boys.

Sandy Sandstedt won the 100-meter breast stroke for girls 13 and 14 in the "B" Division.

The club had four winners in the "C" Division: Peter Maertens won both the 25-meter fly and back stroke for boys eight and under; Mark Robeck, 50

back, senior boys; Ronald Giarola, 50 fly, boys 11-12; and Rene Tank, 25 breast, girls 11 and 12.

Earning second-place medals were: "A" Div. — David Dowell, 100 free and 50 back, boys 10 and under; "B" Div. — Kerry Kuttler, 100 free, senior boys; "C" Div. — Ronny Giarola, 200 individual medley, boys 11-12; Lourdes Oliver, 50 breast, senior girls; Sandy Sandstedt, 50 breast, senior girls. Third-place finishes: "A" Div.

The girls 13-14 freestyle relay team placed second. It was composed of Sandy Sandstedt, Karen Smith, Ginny Smith and Oguita Oliver.

The boys 13-14 freestyle and medley relays placed third in both outings. The boys teams included Ross Rodaro, Mark Robeck, Ed Kahil, David Comstock and Chris Stephenson.

The girls 13-14 medley team also placed third. It was composed of Oguita Oliver, Ginny Smith, Sandy Sandstedt and Karen Smith.

A third-place finish also was tabulated by the boys 11-12 freestyle, made up of Mark Kahil, Kyle Lewallen, John Smith and Ronny Giarola.

Marvel Named Vice President Of Texas World Speedway

Dan Holloway, owner of the Texas World Speedway, announced that Bill Marvel was named Vice President and General Manager of the modern motorsports facility.

Marvel's recent appointment to his new post was announced following the resignation of Ed Hamblen, who had served as the Director of Racing Activities at the track since May of 1972.

Hamblen resigned because his position as the Executive Director of Texas World Speedway did not allow him the time that he needed to spend with various other business interests, including the operation of Meyer Speedway

located in nearby Houston.

However, Hamblen will continue to serve the speedway as an advisor for future races upon the request of his successor, Bill Marvel, and track owner, Dan Holloway.

Marvel, who has a vast background in professional automobile racing, was the Public Relations Director at Pocono International Raceway for the past three years.

Marvel and his family have immediate plans to make their new home in College Station.

In addition to Marvel's assignment to Texas World Speedway, Holloway also announced plans for a second USAC Twin 200's, scheduled for Saturday, October 6th. The second USAC sanctioned twin bill event will include the same format as the Texas Twin 200's held at TWS last April.

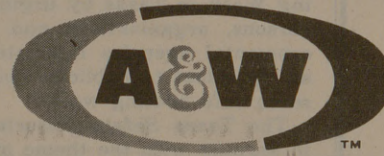
Lacrosse is noted for free-wheeling play due to lenient rules and is considered by many to be the most exciting game around.

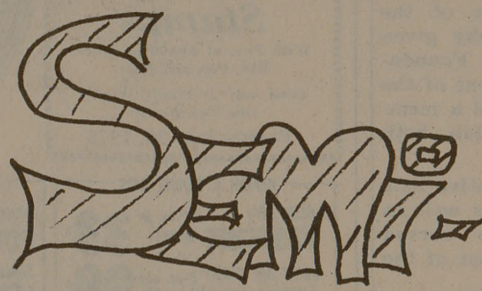
