

Hertz Fellowship Awarded Chemist

The Fannie and John Hertz Foundation announces that Ms. Leslie E. Bauman, 114 Jordan Lane, West Lafayette, Ind., daughter of Mr. Loyal Bauman, has been awarded one of 29 new fellowships for graduate work leading to advanced degrees in the applied physical sciences during the coming fellowship tenure year 1973-74. Ms. Bauman is presently at A&M where she will continue her studies under her grant from the Fannie and John Hertz Foundation.

As a newly appointed Fellow of the Foundation, Ms. Bauman will "complete the required chemistry courses, take a few courses in Education, and undertake a research project," according to a Foundation spokesman.

After graduation from West Lafayette High School, Ms. Bauman went on to major in physical chemistry at Purdue University, Lafayette, Ind., where she was chosen Outstanding

Woman in Chemistry in 1968, and held a Purdue Alumni Association Scholarship. She is a member of the honor societies Alpha Lambda Delta, Iota Sigma Pi and Phi Beta Kappa, and was awarded a Special Departmental Fellowship from the Department of Chemistry, 1972-73.

The Fannie and John Hertz Foundation Fellowships, among the most highly regarded and sought after grants in the country, were established by the will of the late Mr. and Mrs. Hertz to stimulate greater interest and progress in the fields of engineering and the applied physical sciences. Among their primary concerns during their lifetime were the "promotion of education and the improvement of the defense potential of the United States" through the encouragement of imaginative and inventive development in these areas.

History Prof To Write Politician's Biography

One of the principal architects of national farm legislation during the Roosevelt years is the subject of a biography underway at A&M.

He is Marvin Jones of Amarillo, whose political career began as the "Panhandle Kid" in 1916 and expanded to that of close advisor to FDR in Depression times. He was a confidant of House Speaker Sam Rayburn and political mentor to a fledgling congressman named Lyndon B. Johnson.

Long-time observers of the national legislative scene will recall Jones as the prime mover, father and savior of the old Triple-A (Agricultural Adjustment Acts), a testament to his New Deal fervor. Other major legislation which bore his stamp included the Farm Credit Act and the Soil Conservation and Domestic Allotment Act.

Jones' biographer is Dr. Irvin May, assistant professor in the History Department. May also is serving this summer as assistant professor and agricultural historian in the Agricultural Communications Department.

Dr. William Tedrick, editor and head of the Agricultural Communications Department, said the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station initiated the project because "we believe that it is important to document the contributions Jones has made to agricultural development in Texas and across the nation."

"We see this as what may be

the first step in a rather extensive agricultural history focusing on Texas men and women who have had a part in bringing agriculture to where it is today," Tedrick said.

Eventually, May's studies will lead to a book, now tentatively titled "Marvin Jones: Agrarian Advocate."

The historian's extensive research into the Jones era, which has produced mountains of notes and documents, has already borne fruit from an unexpected source. While gathering data on Jones, he interviewed Washington news Correspondent Bascom Timmons, whose news career in the nation's capital dates back to 1917.

At the professor's suggestion, Timmons has turned his files (described as one of the most efficient and complete in Washington) over to the A&M library.

May regards Jones as a father of farm legislation with more than 50 years of service as congressman, administrator and jurist. Texas A&M bestowed an honorary doctorate on the official in 1952.

The historian's detailed research and interviews have traced Jones' career back to his birth in 1886 on a farm in Cooke County. Jones attended Southwestern University in Georgetown and the University of Texas, and received his law degree.

Marvin Jones practiced law in Amarillo until elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1916. The young politician represented

his district from 1917-40. During that time, he served 20 years on the House Agriculture Committee and chaired that powerful group from 1931-40.

May said he knows of no other congressman who has sponsored more significant agricultural legislation than has Jones. Soil and water conservation were favored projects.

In addition to the legislation already named, Jones was one of the principals in the Emergency Farm Mortgage Refinancing Act, Jones-Connelly Farm Relief Act, Bankhead-Jones Farm Tenancy Act, Jones-Costigan Sugar Act, agricultural marketing agreements and commodity exchange legislation. Such activities kept him in close contact with Henry A. Wallace, then secretary of agriculture.

In 1940, Jones was appointed to the U. S. Court of Claims by President Roosevelt. His judicial duties were interrupted during World War II when the president made him advisor and assistant to the Director of Economic Stabilization, and later, administrator of the U.S. War Food Administration.

He returned to the Court of Claims as the war ended. Two years later, President Truman tapped the Texan as the court's chief judge.

In 1964, Jones asked to be placed on inactive status. President Johnson rewarded his former political teacher with an appointment as Senior Judge, a post he still serves.
