# Alpha Phi Mu Awarded National Honor

A&M's student chapter of Alpha Phi Mu, the industrial engineering honor society, has been designated first place national winner of the 1971-72 Outstanding Chapter Award competition. Membership in APM is limited to juniors in the upper fifth of the industrial engineering class, and to seniors in the upper third,

who have demonstrated qualities of leadership, ethicality, sociability and breadth of interest.

The 1971-72 national competition included some 50 member chapters. The chapters were evaluated on chapter projects and

activities, completeness of annual report, promptness in answering correspondence and submitting reports, scholastic average of chapter and other areas of academic activities.

Dr. A. R. Burgess, current

president of the national professional chapter of APM and professor in the Department of Industrial Engineering at A&M, identified major student chapter activities which were instrumental in granting the award.

"During the period covered by the award," Dr. Burgess explained, "our students hosted delegates from throughout the nation and Puerto Rico at a biennial convention held here at A&M. The annual report of the chapter submitted to the executive reviewing committee was also of chief importance in the award."

President of the 1971-72 chapter receiving the award was James Christian, now an industrial engineer with Lone Star Steel, according to Dr. Burgess. Chairman of the local host con-

vention committee was Lt. Col. George F. Heinrich.

"Receiving this award is particularly meaningful to industrial engineering students at A&M," Dr. Burgess noted, "because it reflects their active interest in the student role and in the profession. The students further express this interest by hosting technical meetings with speakers and giving a freshman scholarship."

Richard Anderson, current Alpha Phi Mu president at A&M, said the 1973-74 student chapter is focusing on letting people know what industrial engineering is about and drawing quality students into the curriculum at A&M.

The winner of the 1972-73 national chapter award has not yet been determined.

## Olsen To Attend Conference

Georgie K. Olsen, a junior chemical engineering major at A&M, will attend a joint engineering conference in New Hampshire Aug. 19-24.

The conference, co-sponsored by the Engineering Foundation, the Society of Women Engineers and Engineer's Council for Professional Development, is on "Career Guidance for Women Entering Engineering." The goal of the conference, which will be held at New England College in Henniker, N. J., is to inform young women interested in pursuing a career in engineering.

Women engineers in industrial, governmental and academic fields will speak on their careers and participate in discussion sessions with the students.

Mrs. Olsen is president-elect of the A&M Society of Women Engineers, and is a former vice president of the group. A Distinguished Student with a grade point ratio of 3.933 on A&M's 4.0 system, she is also a member

of the Cap & Gown Society and the American Institute of Chemical Engineers at A&M.

The A&M coed represented the university at a meeting of the National Executive Committee of SWE in Dallas last February. She is also the SWE representative to the Dean's Council and the Engineering Council.

The Engineering Foundation is paying Mrs. Olsen's travel and conference expenses. She is the wife of Paul R. Olsen, 4311 Old College Road, Bryan.

## Two Additional Courses Set

The stack sampling short course held recently by A&M's Chemical Engineering Department has been met with so much enthusiasm that two more identical courses have been tentatively scheduled, according to course director Dr. W. B. Harris.

He said many organizations that sent personnel to the initial course have expressed a desire to send more of their staff members to like courses. One course, scheduled for Aug. 13-17, has enrolled more than 20 participants, Dr. Harris said.

Another course, set for Nov. 12-16, has been tentatively scheduled to accommodate the expected interest generated by the August course.

The courses aid industry and governmental personnel in compliance with Rule 9 of the Texas Air Control Board, which states that all stacks that emit pollutants must be regularly monitored and the results submitted to TACB for analysis.

The courses are limited to not more than 25 students per session, enabling instructors to maintain a close working relationship with participants, Dr. Harris noted.

"The courses will be basically the same as the first one," he explained, "but we will have more practical work and less classroom theory in the next two sessions."

## Hartley Picked As Delegate

Dr. H. O. Hartley, director of the Institute of Statistics at A&M, has been selected as a delegate to the International Statistical Institute Convention in Vienna, Austria.

Hartley will present a paper entitled "Multiple Frame Surveys" Aug. 20 and will also participate in a discussion of "Analytic Studies of Survey Data" Aug. 23.

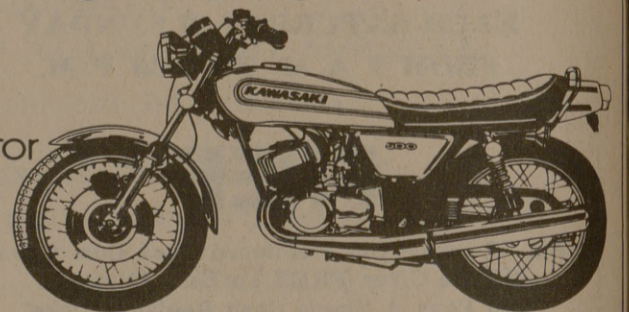
