

'72 Leaders Return For '73 Season

DALLAS—It appears the same old faces will be operating in the same old places when the Southwest Conference ticks off its 58th football season next month.

The largest group of individual leaders in several years is on hand at the eight schools playing for the championship.

Everywhere you look there are runners threatening all sorts of school and conference records. The top six rushers of the 1972 season are all back and eight of the top ten have at least one more year.

Likewise, eight of the leading receivers return, along with three of the top five passers, six of the top eight scorers, seven of the ten total offense leaders and all five of the tandem offense (yards gained rushing and receiving) leaders.

The rushing corps boasts three 1,000-yard-plus gainers from 1972—Texas' Roosevelt Leaks, Arkansas' Dickey Morton and SMU's Alvin Maxson. Morton and Maxson currently rank tenth and 11th, respectively, on the all-time career rushing charts in the SWC and both appear almost certain to pass current runner-up Jim Swink of TCU. Morton needs 599 yards and Maxson 601 to tie

Swink. Morton needs 1,213 yards to pass all-time leader Chris Gilbert of Texas.

Although top gunners Bruce Gadd of Rice and Joe Ferguson of Arkansas have departed, returnees Neal Jeffrey of Baylor, Joe Barnes of Texas Tech and Keith Bobo of SMU ranked third through fifth, respectively.

Among top receivers returning are Rice's Edwin Collins (No. 2), Ron Arceneaux and Ferguson (both tied for tenth); SMU's Kenny Harrison (No. 4); Baylor's Charles Dancer (No. 5) and Brian Kilgore (No. 9); A&M's Richard Osborne (No. 6); and Texas' Jim Moore (No. 8).

While Maxson lost the rushing championship he claimed as a sophomore, he did grab the scoring title on 13 touchdowns. Tech kicker Don Grimes was third in scoring, Texas kicker Billy Schott was fourth, Luttrell sixth, and Leaks and TCU's Berl Simmons tied for seventh.

Barnes finished the '72 season as the SWC's third-leading total offense generator, while fifth through tenth spots went to returnees Bobo, Leaks, Morton, Jeffrey, Maxson and Luttrell.

And the top five tandem offense performers, all back again, were Morton, Leaks, Maxson, Smith and Morris.

And, just to unsettle the defense, it might be pointed out that Leaks, Luttrell, Harrison, Osborne, Morris, Ferguson and Jeffrey all have from two to three years of remaining eligibility.

Sportswriters On Press Tour

DALLAS—42 Texas and Arkansas sportswriters and sportscasters departed Dallas Sunday afternoon on the 23rd annual pre-season press tour of Southwest Conference football teams.

The 10-day trip opened Monday at the University of Arkansas, from where the group flew to Lubbock to visit Texas Tech and on to Houston for stops at Rice Wednesday and the University of Houston on Thursday.

From there the trip will be completed by charter bus, with visits scheduled at A&M on Friday, Texas on Saturday, Baylor the next Monday, TCU on Tuesday and SMU on Wednesday, Sept. 5. Five SWC teams open the season 10 days later on Saturday, Sept. 15—Arkansas at defending champion Southern Cal, Baylor entertaining Oklahoma, Rice vs. Houston in the Harris County Domed Stadium, Santa Clara at SMU and Wichita State at A&M.

Little Rock, Ark., will have the largest representation on the tour for the second straight year with seven newsmen and cameramen scheduled to travel.



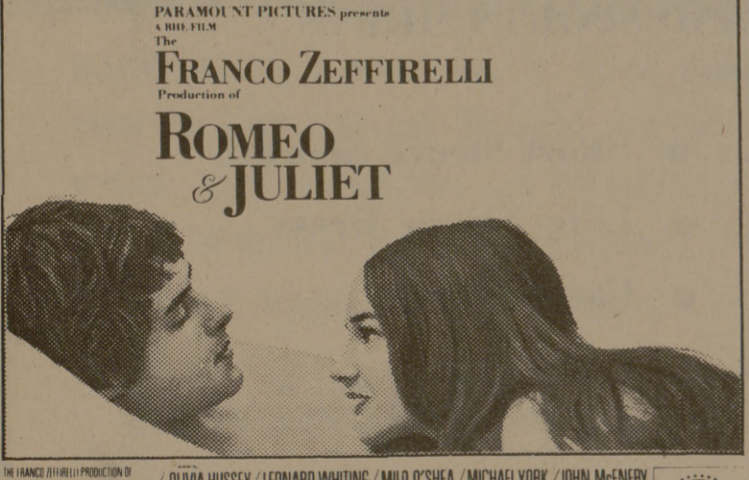
