The four were among the 27 victims of a homosexual-murder case that broke Aug. 8 when Elmer Wayne Henley, 17, told police he had shot and killed Dean Corll, 33. Henley and a co-defendant, David Owen Brooks, 18, later told police Corll was the mastermind of the three-year procurement - torture - murder scheme.

Bodies of two youths believed to have been brothers, Jerry Lynn Waldrop, 13, and Donald Waldrop, 15, were buried Aug. 18 near Atlanta, Ga., after having been discovered in a boat stall Corll rented in southwest Houston.

Dr. Joseph Jachimczyk, Harris County medical examiner, announced Friday, however, that the bodies buried in Atlanta actually were those of David Hilligiest, 13, and Gregory Malley Winkle, 16, both of Houston. He said the bodies of the Waldrop brothers still were in the county

Of the 18 bodies identified so far, 15 resided in or formerly resided in Houston's Heights area. Another of the identified resided in southwest Houston but atin southwest Houston but attended a driving school where On Campus Henley also was enrolled.

The Waldrop brothers resided in the Heights when they disappeared in January 1971. The Hilligiest and Winkle boys also resided in the Heights.

Jachimczyk blamed the identification mixup on information provided by Everett Waldrop, father of the two brothers.

"Mr. Waldrop drove here from Atlanta," Jachimczyk said. "He described the clothing, height

A&M Program Boosted by EPA Grant

A training program at A&M received a boost with a grant from the Environmental Protection Agency, announced Cong. Olin E. (Tiger) Teague.

The program, which trains graduate students in waste water treatment and aquatic systems management, is offered by the Environmental Engineering Division of the Civil Engineering Department.

Directed by Dr. Roy Hann Jr., the program has been funded for more than eight years by EPA and previously by the Federal Water Pollution Control Administration and the Public Health

The training program is designed to prepare scientists and engineers for active roles in the water pollution control field through a system of academic course work and research development.

More than 60 graduate students have been supported through the program. Grants total more than \$500,000 since initial funding was awarded in September, 1964.

The program, administered by the Texas Engineering Experiment Station, received \$46,000 in additional funds for operation through the 1973-74 academic year. Nine graduate students will have support from the program in the coming year.
