Shipman Doubtful for Wichita Contest

The Texas Aggies went through a 90-minute rehearsal drill Wednesday afternoon, putting

ting polish to their game-plan for the Wichita State Shockers who invade Kyle Field for a 7:30 p.m. Saturday football battle.

Offensive coordinator Ben Hurt said his unit was looking better each day and was picking up Wichita's defensive alignments well.

Defensive coordinator Melvin Robertson was equally pleased with his group. "We have our full game plan in now and need only to execute a couple of more times in practice and we'll be ready to play."

The Aggies spent a lot of time on their passing game and quarterback Mike Jay was hitting

ends Carl Roaches and Richard Osborne consistently.

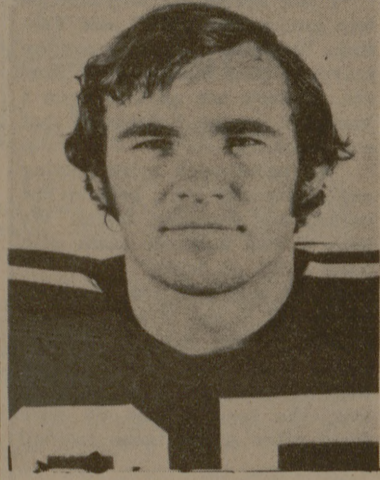
Back-up quarterbacks David Walker and Tim Trimmier also

were on target most of the afternoon. It is highly doubtful that freshman quarterback David Shipman will play because of a sprained knee.

The Aggies were in full pads for Wednesday's session but likely will be in shorts Thursday and Friday as they start tapering off for the 7:30 p.m. Saturday kickoff.

The Shockers from Wichita State are due to fly into the Houston airport Friday, bus up to College Station and work out at Kyle Field Friday afternoon.

Baylor

The Baylor Bears closed out preparations Wednesday for their Saturday night opener against the University of Oklahoma with a spirited workout despite the heat and humidity.

Coach Grant Teaff said that it appeared that the Bruins were ready. "It was terribly hot out there but we got total effort and made very few mental mistakes. I think we are about to reach that peak."

Defensive tackle Coy Zunker was the only missing player. The San Antonio senior letterman has been sidelined with a strep throat but is expected to be ready by Saturday night.

TCU's offense this fall will feature a threat barely used the past two years — the forward pass.

The Horned Frogs have abandoned the Wishbone for the Slot I formation and that means a more wide open attack.

The change has been very evident in scrimmages to date. Quarterback Kent Marshall of Austin has completed 23 of 31 passes for 382 yards. His backups, sophomore Lee Cook of Jacksboro and senior Perry Senn of Richardson, also have been putting the ball in the air often.

"We are going to pass," said TCU offensive coordinator Russell Coffee. "We're not spending all that time working on throwing the ball just for the heck of it."

Three Indicted In OU Scandal

GALVESTON (AP) — Joe Woolley, former head football coach at Galveston Ball High School, was among three persons indicted by a Galveston County grand jury Wednesday on charges of altering grade records of high school athletes.

Indicted on misdemeanor charges of altering official academic records, as covered under article 429 of the Texas Education Code, were Woolley, Lynn Nix, former Ball High assistant principal, and Richard Streiff, former Ball High principal.

Oklahoma revealed the alterations and forfeited eight of its football victories last season including its Sugar Bowl victory over Penn State. The Big Eight Conference later put Oklahoma on two years probation.
