AUSTIN—U.S. District Court Judge Jack Roberts said Wednesday that President Nixon's impoundment of funds allocated by Congress for water pollution projects was illegal.

Roberts ordered the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to revise its 1973 and 1974 budget to give Texas and other states the \$11 million that Congress had intended they get.

"This decision, if upheld, would free monies urgently needed by Texas municipalities to meet water pollution control standards and to ensure the protection of the health of this state's citizens," said Texas Atty. Gen. John Hill.

AUSTIN—Two of the five series of grade school reading materials approved Wednesday by the State Textbook committee were among those that drew protests at public hearings.

The committee adopted four series on its first ballot, including "Sound of Language," published by Holt, Rinehart and Winston, which had been criticized by Mrs. Mel Gabler of Longview.

One of Mrs. Gabler's criticisms was that some of the material is "Sounds of Language" is printed backward, upside down or in a circle.

The publisher responded to that by saying the books teach that type can move "in other ways. They are helped to view these nontraditional uses of type as puzzles and adventures and not as threats."

AUSTIN—Dolph Briscoe issued an executive order Wednesday calling for an immediately intensive effort by the state to solve the problems of Texas youths.

Briscoe's order created the Interagency Task Force on Youth Care and Rehabilitation.

WASHINGTON—The Cost of Living Council is considering creating an advisory board of gasoline dealers to help ease its conflict with retail gasoline stations over Phase 4 price ceilings.

This was disclosed Tuesday by a council spokesman, who said a major purpose of the panel would be to provide retailers with a sounding board for their complaints.

WASHINGTON—The Supreme Court will consider whether cable television systems are subject to copyright laws and whether strikers are entitled to welfare benefits in its new session.

The television and welfare cases were among more than 20 accepted by the high court Tuesday for adjudication.

At the same time, the justices sidestepped consideration of numerous other cases presented to them, including ones dealing with presidential impoundment of federal funds and equal pay for saleswomen in a clothing store.

International
ISRAEL—Israel said its jets attacked Damascus airport and other targets deep in Syria and Egypt on Wednesday as Iraq announced its forces had joined the fighting in a major widening of the war.

Jordan, a 1967 combatant that has stayed out of the current fighting, called up its reserves in what could signal another significant escalation adding a third front to the conflict.

Communications indicated armored battalions in the Golan Heights and the Sinai peninsula ground into something resembling a stalemate as the new Arab-Israeli struggle settled into its fifth day. Developments indicated neither side was capable of a quick, clear-cut victory.

GUADALAJARA, Mexico — Four gunmen broke into the home of Britain's honorary diplomatic representative in Guadalajara Wednesday morning and kidnapped him, police said.

Police said they had no word from the kidnapers, who wore ski masks and carried submachine guns, nor did they have any word on the fate of Dr. Anthony Duncan Williams, the Mexican-born honorary consul for Britain in Guadalajara.

Williams, 47, was preparing to leave his home when the gunmen burst in at 8:30 a.m. He was to attend a meeting between a British commercial delegation and Jalisco State Gov. Alberto Orozco Romero at the governor's office.

The prosecutor said Matz made no more illegal payments to Agnew until after he became vice president, when Matz figured what he considered to be his overdue bill and delivered \$10,000 to Agnew in payment for other state work granted the Matz firm in the last half of 1968.

The prosecutor said Matz made several subsequent payments to Agnew including \$2,500 in return for a General Services Administration contract to a small engineering company which Matz partly owned.

The Justice Department said Hammerman and Green entered into a formal agreement to cooperate in the investigation and to plead guilty to violating a felony provision of the Internal Revenue Code. It said they face a maximum sentence of three years. The agreement said their cooperation would be brought to the attention of the sentencing court.

The government said Matz and Wolff cooperated in the investigation but did not enter into any agreement except to receive assurances that their own disclosures would not be used against them.
