SAN ANTONIO, Tex. — The president of a powerful dairy-men's cooperative pleaded ignorance Wednesday to an alleged \$2 million commitment by the milk industry to the reelection campaign of President Nixon.

John E. Butterbrodt of Burnett, Wis., issued a statement here through the national headquarters

of Associated Milk Producers, Inc.

"We learned of memoranda relative to alleged commitment of \$2 million to the Nixon campaign in 1970 on Friday, Oct. 12, 1973. Again, no person now with AMPI has any knowledge of whether such commitment, or any commitment, was made," Butterbrodt said.

The statement did not say how the cooperative learned of such memoranda.

WASHINGTON — President Nixon, preoccupied with developments in the Middle East, postponed today until sometime Friday a television-radio news conference that had been scheduled for tonight.

Deputy Press Secretary Gerald L. Warren said Nixon was concentrating so thoroughly on the Middle East crisis that he decided to postpone the session scheduled for 9 p.m. EDT. No time was set for the Friday news conference.

WASHINGTON — AFL-CIO President George Meany called President Nixon emotionally unstable Wednesday, but the White House quickly replied that Nixon's health is excellent.

"The events of the last several days prove the dangerous emotional instability of the President," said a statement released by Meany's office.

Meany repeated his suggestion that Nixon should resign or be impeached and called for a new Watergate special prosecutor to replace Archibald Cox who was fired by Nixon Saturday. "We firmly believe there must be a completely independent investiga-

TOKYO—The Chinese Communists have criticized both the Soviet Union and the United States for trying to end the Middle East war, which they see as a just fight on the part of the Arabs.

The official news agency charged that Moscow and Washington were involved in big-power politics centering around a grab for Middle East oil.

A no-war, no-peace truce suits both big powers more than a resolution recognizing Arab claims, the agency said.

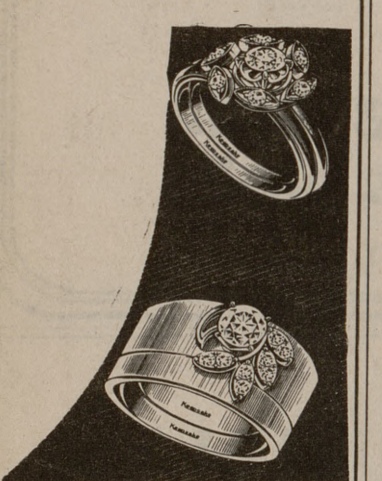
