Conference To Feature Hobby, Hill

The first annual Symposium of Air Pollution Control in the Southwest will host more than 500 air quality engineers, equipment manufacturers and governmental representatives of air quality boards.

Lt. Gov. Hobby will deliver the keynote address at the first day's session. He will speak at 9:30 a.m. in the main lecture room of the Zachry Engineering Center.

The Attorney General will deliver a banquet address at 7 p.m. Nov. 5 in the Ramada Inn Ballroom. Other speakers will represent government and industry in air pollution control.
