

AUSTIN-The Texas Constitutional Revision Commission will present its proposed new Constitution for Texas to the presiding officers of the state Legislature in ceremonies at 2:30 p.m. Thursday, November 1, in the State Capitol.

The presentation fulfills the charge given to the Commission to study the present state Constitution and report its recommendations to the Legislature.

HOUSTON - The American Dental Association's House of Delegates approved Wednesday a resolution calling on schools, especially those receiving federal aid, to ban sugar-rich food.

The action came at the 114th annual convention of the ADA which ends Thursday.

**Movies Focus** On Careers Of Directors

"The Men Who Made the Movies" is coming via Channel 15 Sunday night. An eight-part series of two 90 minute and six minute programs, it focuses on the films and careers of veteran Hollywood directors.

Produced under a Kodak grant by WNET-TV, New York City, the series will be broadcast on successive Sundays by the Public Broadcasting Service in conjunction with TAMU.

Ron Walsh, known for such films as "They Died With Their Boots On," and "The Naked and the Dead," will be the subject of the first program.

Succeeding broadcasts will feature Frank Capra, Howard Hawks, King Vidor, George Coukor. William Wellman, Alfred Hitchcock and Vincente Minnelli. Cliff Robertson, who starred in the Kodak sponsored "The Man Without A Country," will narrate. Richard Schikel, the noted film critic, produced the series.

This series focuses on the director, not the star. The last two decades have been known as the "age of the directors." Much more emphasis has been placed on the role of the director than ever before. The names of Fellini and Bergman have had much more lasting magic than any actor. Hawks and Hitchcock, both subjects of the series, are known for their distinct style and method.
