

Board Hasn't Discussed Birth Control

part-time or during the summer to put themselves through school and are definitely in the lower

income bracket.
"Fees for a doctor and contraceptives may be an extreme hardship for these people, and this is just one more reason that the Family Planning Center should be made available to the entire community."

According to Self, University Health Center Administrator Dr. Hal Powe did receive a letter from Williams for public notice which said that contraceptives would not be made available to students.

"This is a personal item," said H. C. Bell Jr., Board member from Austin. "I don't know how this matter should be handled at TAMU nor how it is handled at other universities."

"With the 3,850 ladies on the campus, we may need to get into this gynecological thing which would mean we need to get someone on the staff to handle it," continued Bell.

When asked his views on the possibility of having a gynecologist on the TAMU campus, Williams said he had no views on the matter.

"We did have one that comes in occasionally to take care of the student's health—that is what the health center is for."

Vice President for Student Services Dr. John J. Koldus said that Williams never said there couldn't be a gynecologist on the TAMU campus.

"What the administration is concerned with is the use of birth control pills by single students, not necessarily the married students," Koldus said.

"I don't really know what Williams and his group are doing," said Bell. "I do imagine the budget is set for the year and something of this nature could not be entered into until next year."

Bell also said that the family planning service located at Prairie View A&M University is a

county-wide clinic which "serves a lot of miles and area."

The clinic on the Prairie View campus is funded with a \$65,000 grant and has approximately 720 students enrolled in the program.

"I feel that there is a possibility that we would have some interest in this kind of service. We must remember that both TAMU and the board are conservative," continued Bell.

"We don't really know what our problems with the women are since their presence at TAMU

is still relatively new. If we have the need for a doctor specializing in women's health, I'm sure we'll try to get the best we could."

Bell said the problems would lie with financing a physician who could do the work and still be considered good in his field.

"I think the board would meet the issue defensively but as we become more aware of the problem, the board will make some arrangement to have it handled," said Bell.
