Country, Rock Dance

An after-the-game Country and Rock Dance is scheduled Saturday by the Memorial Student Center Dance Committee.

"Denim" will provide music for the 8 p.m. to midnight event. It will take place at Indian Lake, south of College Station on State Hwy. 6 just past Texas World

Speedway, according to Chairman Gary Anderson.

Admission will be \$1.50 per couple or \$1 stag. The dance is the second of the MSC committee, one of 19 in the Council and Directorate that provide for TAMU students' entertainment, cultural and hobby interests.

Teacher Workshop

TAMU will host more than 130 first and second-year post-secondary teachers in a health occupations workshop conducted by the Vocational Industrial Teacher Education Department of the Engineering Extension Service.

The workshop starting Monday

is held with the cooperation of the Texas Education Agency, according to course coordinator Gene Fisher.

The five-day course will be held at the J. Earl Rudder Conference Center from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily, according to Fisher.

Dangerous Substance Study

A Dallas-based TAMU researcher has completed a study for the Hazardous and Toxic Substances Task Force (HATS) of the National Resource Defense Council.

Dr. Harold W. Wolf, director of the jointly sponsored Water Resources Center, a project of

TAMU and the City of Dallas, worked with Mrs. Sarida Saleh, a doctoral candidate at the University of Dallas and city employee, and Steven E. Esmond, a TAMU graduate student in civil engineering, in examination of a HATS-prepared list of toxic pollutants.

Offshore Oil Exploration

A new concept in offshore oil exploration was proposed by TAMU researchers Thursday in a meeting with representatives of government and the oil industry. The exploration program, entitled "Continental Slope Explor-

ation Program (CONSEP)," is designed to study the upper continental slope in the Gulf of Mexico using a multidisciplinary approach. The study area has recently been opened for exploration by the government.

Training Center Enrollment

Twelve students have enrolled in a station installation school at TAMU's Electrical and Telephone Training Center.

The three-week course is conducted by Marvin Moss, instructor

from the Engineering Extension Service, a division of TAMU.

The course will cover the use of telephones, meters, buried cable, telephone installation specifications, cable counts and terminal blocks.

Graduate Seminar Series

Dr. Charles A. Homsy, director of the Prosthetics Research Laboratory at Methodist Hospital in Houston, will speak Monday at the graduate seminar series in TAMU's Bioengineering Department.

Dr. Homsy will discuss biomaterials research at the Hos-

ton hospital. His talk at 12 noon will be held in Room 105C of the Zachry Engineering Center.

The seminar, headed by Dr. William Hyman, offers graduate students and interested persons a chance to hear outstanding figures in the bioengineering profession.

Steaks to Make Sbisia Appearance

Sirloin and T-bone steaks will make their appearance a weekly feature of the existing board plan again starting Thursday, announced Col. Fred Dollar, director of Food Services.

The decision to have steaks once a week was made in the first meeting of the joint menu board, which consists of five representatives from each of the three dining halls on campus. No members were present to represent students using Duncan Dining Hall.

Dollar noted that the decision to cut three steaks from the five-week food cycle came earlier in the year when Food Services was faced with either raising board costs again or running out of money. He said prices have now dropped, making purchases less expensive.

He added that two major items were dropped from the menu plan in exchange for the steaks: one turkey and dressing

meal, which leaves three meals of that type; and the only Mexican dinner that was served in the cycle.

Dollar said that it costs his department \$9,400 to pay for the meat alone in steak dinners.

After receiving complaints from students who were unable to get second helpings on a recent meal, the director said he had made it clear to his personnel that students should always get second helpings on at least one meat item.

Dollar said that his personnel are studying the feasibility of removing Saturday and Sunday breakfast meals to pay for a Sunday evening meal. Dollar said there has been some demand for this change, but that he would put it before paying board students for a vote before making any changes.

In other business, Dollar noted that the annual Thanksgiving Dinner would be Nov. 15 for all students.

Egypt Trades Ambassadors

CAIRO (AP) — Egypt and the United States have agreed to exchange ambassadors immediately, the official Middle East New Agency said this morning. Egypt

broke diplomatic relations with the United States during the 1967 Arab-Israeli war because of U. S. support for Israel. Since then the two countries

have maintained contacts through small diplomatic missions in each other's capitals under the flag of friendly nations. But these missions were not of formal ambassadorial status.

The news agency announced an exchange of ambassadors came five hours after President Anwar Sadat and Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger met three hours privately.
