PORT ISABEL, Tex.—Searchers probing the Laguna Madre for the wreckage of what was believed a private plane indicated Wednesday they may have found the wreckage of several airplanes. Some of the wreckage was identified as that of military planes. The search site is not far from an area used during World War II as an Air Force gunnery range. Searchers theorized that some of the wreckage might be from drone aircraft used for the range.

BROWNSVILLE, Tex.—Asst. U.S. Atty. John Smith said Wednesday the Agriculture Department is investigating the disappearance of surplus food valued at \$358,450 in Cameron County. The Agriculture Department furnished the surplus food to the county.

A county grand jury announced last week that the food was missing. Although indictments were returned, the jury blamed county commissioners for lack of attention to the program.

National

WASHINGTON — President Nixon said Wednesday night he has "no intention of walking away" from the presidency despite some demands that he resign.

Departing from his prepared text in a broadcast speech to the nation on energy policy, he said he would take every action to remove any doubts the American people may have of his personal integrity. After ticking off what he said were the achievements of his past year, Nixon acknowledged that "I would be less than candid if I were not to admit this has not been an easy year in some respects."

WADENA, Minn.—Two jail escapees held a family of six hostage Wednesday and awaited an end to a snowstorm that thwarted their plan to flee aboard a commandeered airplane. Authorities said they would provide the plane for the two, one

an accused murderer. The fugitives said the family would be released once they reached the plane. But the weather intervened and kept the promised airplane on the ground.

Farmer Elmer Wegscheid, his wife and four children were taken hostage in their home Tuesday night by the two escaped prisoners, identified as John P. Morgan, 37, and his 18-year-old companion, William L. Winans.

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. — Hairline cracks in an aging rocket have forced a five-day delay in the launching of the Skylab 3 astronauts.

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration Wednesday set a new launch time of 9:37 a.m. Nov. 15. The shot had been scheduled Saturday.

NEW YORK — There will be plenty of Rolling Stones and Barbara Streisand in the record bins this holiday season, but don't count on finding a copy of Yugoslavian folk songs or a reissue of your favorite vocalist of the '40s. The reason: The petroleum shortage is hitting the record industry.

Alarmed by the growing scarcity of petroleum-based plastics used in making records, some companies have begun cutting back on production, postponing new releases and experimenting with different quality materials.

International

MIDDLE EAST—Israel claimed Wednesday that Egypt is preparing to renew warfare while Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger was commenting after a round of talks in Cairo that "we are moving toward peace." Syria reported a clash on the Golan Heights.

Kissinger made his comment following a three-hour meeting with President Anwar Sadat of Egypt.

A spokesman for the Israeli military command in Tel Aviv said Egyptian troops were stepping up preparations for open warfare.

Postmaster Offers Mailing Suggestions

In an effort to help holiday shoppers with their "mailing worries," Postmaster Gayland Moulder offers the following helpful tips.

If a single item is being mailed, it should be cushioned with shredded paper, excelsior, compressed tissue paper, cloth, or expanded plastic foam.

If two or more items are mailed in the same carton or box, cushioning material should protect all items from contact with each other, and each item should have its own individual wrapper.

Cardboard containers, including large soap, cereal boxes, etc., larger than the gift being mailed should be cut down to about the size of the gift to minimize shaking and breaking in transit.

Fragile articles must be individually cushioned, and all four sides of the container should be padded with cushioning material.

Tape used to seal containers should be durable type and should cover or secure firmly all flaps.

Paper for the outer wrapping should be at least equal in quality and strength to the kraft stock used for grocery bags. Incidentally, such bags, in good condition, provide excellent wrapping when trimmed to the proper size to fit the package snugly.

Wrapped packages also should be secured with strong twine, not ordinary light string. Twine should be knotted at several intersecting points to keep it from loosening.

All packages that contain delicate articles should be marked—FRAGILE.

Each package should contain the name and address of the person to whom it is being mailed inside the package as well as outside. An address contained inside is insurance that it will be received promptly even if accidentally opened or if the outside address should become obliterated.

Be sure to put a return address on the package. And, finally, address the package correctly and legibly. Be sure to include the zip code.
