

testimony of a presidential aide Wednesday raised a question of whether part of yet a third White House Watergate tape may be missing or nonexistent.

The testimony followed notification to U. S. District Court Judge John J. Sirica that President Nixon's personal secretary, Rose Mary Woods, will testify at aa hearing into a White House claim that two crucial presidential conversations on Watergate went unrecorded.

Sirica had summoned Miss Woods to appear.

White House aide John C. Bennett testified before Sirica that Miss Woods called him into her office Tuesday to say she had discovered a "gap" in a tape re-cording made of presidential con-

Bennett, an aide to White House chief of staff Alexander M. Taig Jr., said Miss Woods did not de-

WASHINGTON (AP) - The scribe the tape she was listening to and he did not ask.

Bennett also said she told him that she was not transcribing Watergate tapes and that his own testimony of Tuesday-in which Bennett said he was told that's what she was doing-was wrong.

Exactly which tapes Miss Woods was listening to when she discovered the gap presumably will have to await her own testimony, now expected Thursday.

Douglas Parker, a White House lawyer, said he expected Miss Woods will be allowed to appear

that Miss Woods now has in her possession 14 tapes, eight of them covering the periods listed in subpoenas from the special Watergate prosecution force and six

others delivered to her Monday. The White House said, meanwhile, Nixon is expanding his legal staff to deal with Watergate problems "perhaps more effectively than we have before." Specificially, a spokesman said, Florida lawyer Sam Powers had been recruited for the hearings before Sirica.
