

Fuel Crisis Programs to be Broadcast

Local educational television, KAMU-TV, will present two special programs on the energy crisis tonight.

Cong. Olin E. Teague and former Secretary of the Interior Stewart Udall will be featured on the programs.

Other guests include Dr. H. Guyford Stever, director of the National Science Foundation and science commissioner on the Atomic Energy Commission.

Dr. John Calhoun, vice presi-

dent for academic affairs, will serve as moderator of the first program, which features Teague, Stever and Anders.

The first special will present all aspects of the energy crisis, with discussion of possible solutions. Teague also will comment on possible political overtones of the energy situation.

Cong. Teague is chairman of the Science and Astronautic committee of the U. S. House of Representatives, the committee which

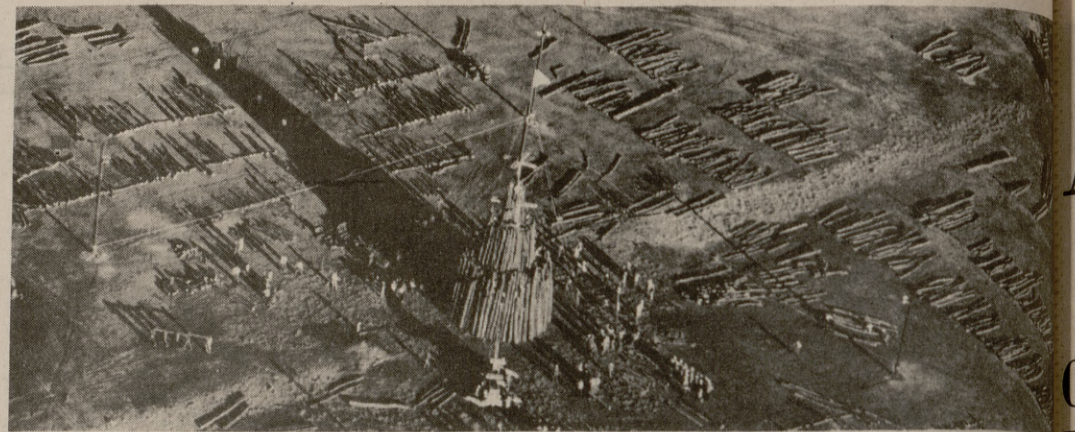
recently established a subcommittee on energy.

The second program explores the contention raised by some of the ecology-minded that atomic energy plants create their own type of pollution. Udall will be interviewed by Channel 15 news director Mark Holcomb and Political Forum representatives Lynn Gibson and Mark Weber.

Udall is currently touring the country as a speaker on the energy crisis.

Each of the specials are 30-minute color presentations. The first program will be aired at 9 p. m. Nov. 21 on Channel 15, the second special follows at 9:30.

The programs are presented in conjunction with the recent annual trustee and councilor meeting of the Research Foundation, which dealt with potential solutions to the energy crisis, and Stewart Udall's Nov. 15 appearance at a Political Forum presentation.

The 12th Air Force CO will also present awards after the Corps briefing to Maj. Alton Meyer, 1960 graduate and former North Vietnamese prisoner-of-war. The 5 p. m. event in Room 301 of the Rudder Tower is open to the public.

Corps Commander Scott Eberhart of Dallas will be presented the George D. and Hesta Mulloy Award at the briefing.
