AUSTIN - Impeccable free throw shooting down the stretch by the Texas Longhorns held off a valiant Texas A&M rally as UT held on for a 98-909 Southwest Conference basketball win before 7,200 fans here Wednesday

The Longhorns scored nine of their last 13 points from the charity stripe as A&M could never close the gap.
