

Driver's death result of trucker shutdown

One driver was killed and scattered violence was reported Thursday as a shutdown by independent truckers spread across Eastern and Appalachian states, and then moved west. Several industries were threatened with layoffs.
In Pittsburg, Pennsylvania Gov. Milton Shapp emerged from a meeting with truckers' representatives convinced the strike will spread and continue. Lt. Gov. Ernest Kline said Shapp would activate the National Guard Friday morning to keep peace on the state's highways.

The independents, who are protesting high fuel prices and low freight rates, "made it clear that they will have their shutdown," Kline said of the meeting which included a group claiming to represent 100,000 independent drivers.
Other truckers' spokesmen also urged a nationwide shutdown of independent drivers, and they said many other drivers were expected to pull their rigs off the roads at midnight Thursday.

mines were said to be on the verge of shutting down because key materials were not being delivered.
In Ohio, Youngstown Sheet & Tube said it will temporarily suspend production of first rolled steel products on Monday because it could not ship its products. About 1,000 workers could be affected.
A spokesman for Bethlehem Steel Co. said the stoppage had caused a virtual standstill in movement of products from the company's Bethlehem, Pa., plant. He said a meeting would be held Friday to discuss a possible lay-off. The plant employs 14,000 people.

WASHINGTON (AP) — More than the proposed defense budget will go to finance the smaller but increasingly well-paid volunteer military. Of President Nixon's proposed \$87-billion defense budget, \$47.5 billion would go to salary, military retirement, housing and other personnel costs.
WASHINGTON (AP) — A tax lawyer invoked the attorney-client privilege in refusing to testify about a conversation with President Nixon, California Secretary of State Edmund G. Brown Jr. said. He said the refusal to tes-

tify "raises the question of just what was discussed" in the conversation immediately after the lawyer backdated a deed to Nixon's vice presidential papers. Brown said the lawyer, Frank De Marco Jr., refused to say under oath whether he told the President the deed was signed more than a year after it was dated.
WASHINGTON (AP) — The national health insurance plan being readied by the administration would guarantee that no one would pay more than \$1,500 a year in medical expenses, according to an initial estimate. For this protection, a single wage earner would pay a monthly premium of \$6.56. For most workers with a family, the premium might be \$19.52 a month. The administration still is putting finishing touches on the proposals for introduction in Congress on Tuesday, an administration official said.

International
CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — The Egyptian government has allocated \$87.5 million to reopen the Suez Canal and restore the war-ravaged towns along its banks. An official of one of the firms bidding to clear the canal said the canal could be open to limited traffic in six months and back in full operation in eight to 10 months.
WASHINGTON (AP) — Farm prices increased 9 per cent in the month ending Jan. 15 and averaged 59 per cent above a year earlier, the Agriculture Department said. Meat animal prices averaged 21 per cent higher than on Jan. 15, 1973, and wheat prices more than doubled during the year.
PAGO PAGO, American Samoa (AP) — Only six survivors are reported in the crash of a Pan American World Airways jetliner on its approach to the Pago Pago airport in the mid-Pacific. The air line said 36 of the 101 persons aboard the Boeing 707 jet were U. S. residents. An airline spokesman said the plane crashed 1,000 yards short of the runway during a heavy rain squall Thursday.
